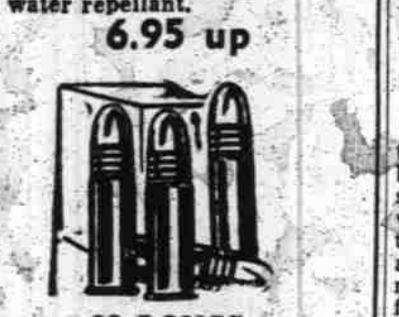

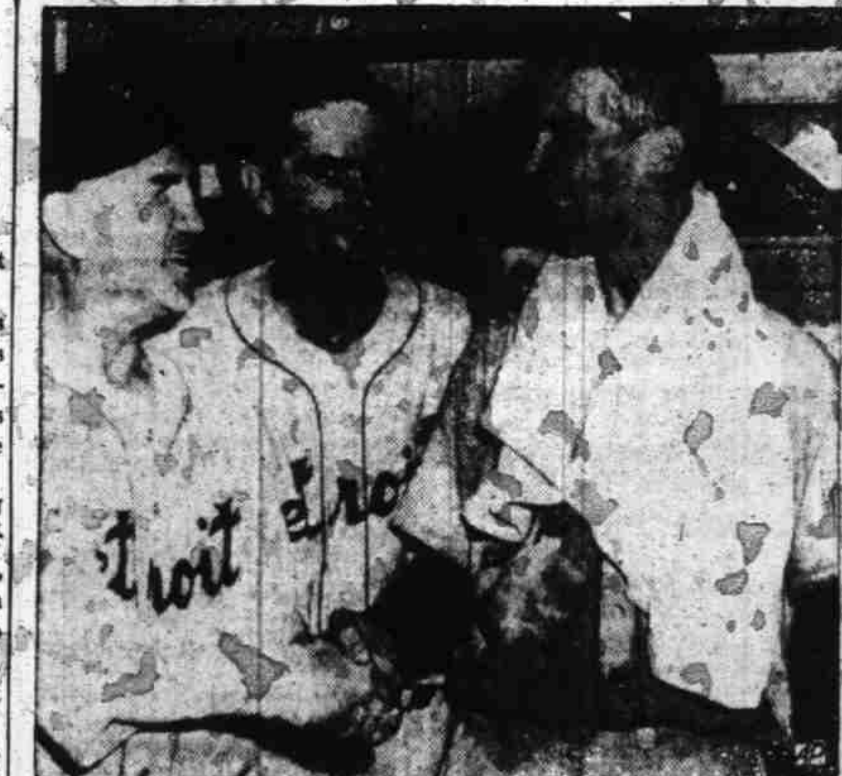

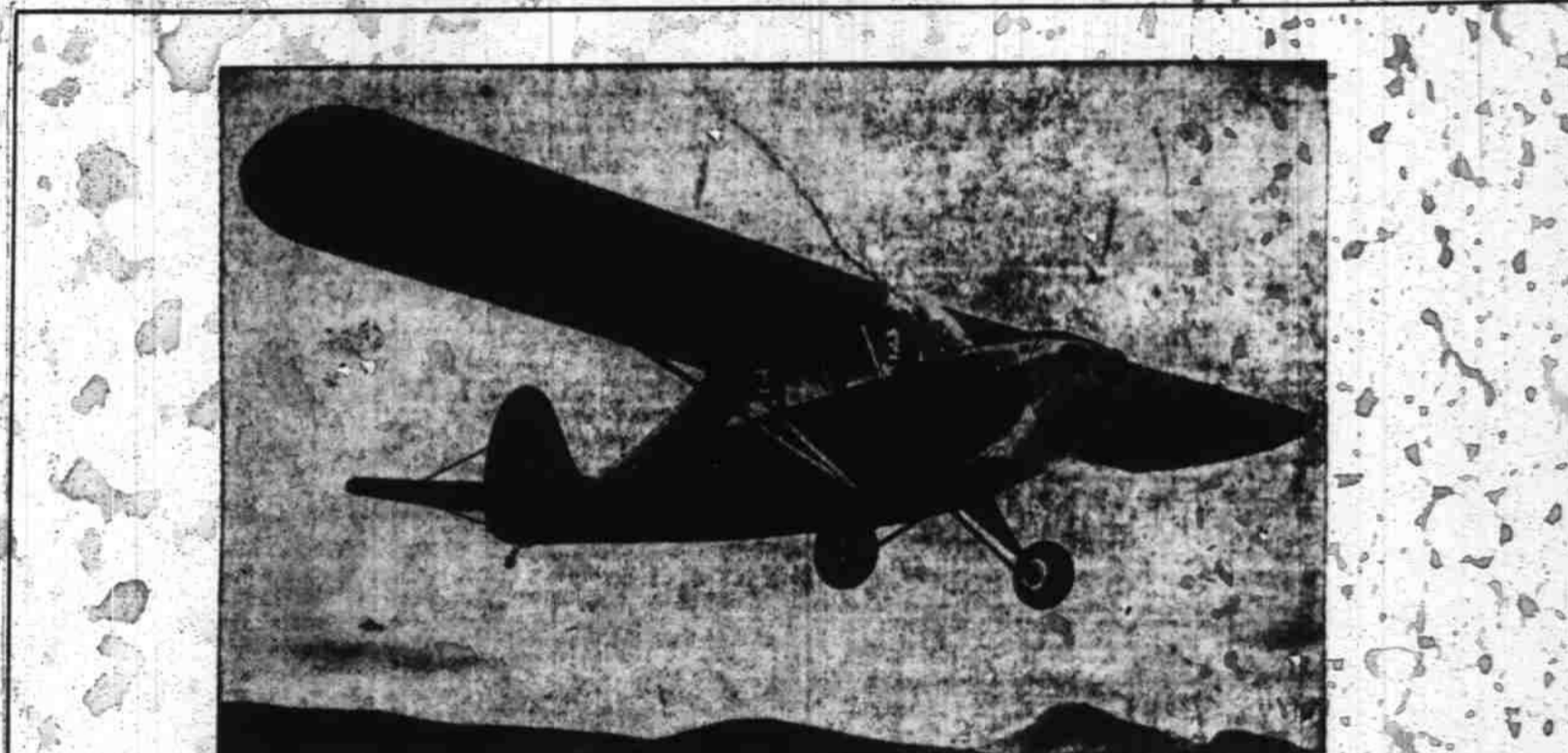

ALLENTOWN, Pa., Sept. 24 (AP)—Mrs. Rhoda Wenger, 24, who gave birth to a daughter after being in a semi-coma six months, will leave Saturday by army hospital plane for California where University of California specialists will try to repair the brain injury she suffered in an automobile accident last November.

Her husband, Leland, an army sergeant, and the baby, Karen Beth, will accompany her on the flight.

Sgt. Wenger, who also was injured seriously in the accident, will be admitted to the Letterman hospital in San Francisco for treatment.

The youthful mother, who gave birth to the baby May 28 while in a condition which doctors described as "suspended death," is still unaware of her daughter. She opens her eyes and smiles, her husband said, but she has not been able to talk.

The baby, who weighed four pounds at birth and now weighs nearly nine pounds, is healthy and normal.

Government Control Means Shortages

GALVESTON, Sept. 24 (AP)—A prediction of increasing shortages as long as government control of prices continues has been made here by G. L. Childress of Houston in speaking before the annual convention of the Texas Retail Grocers Association.

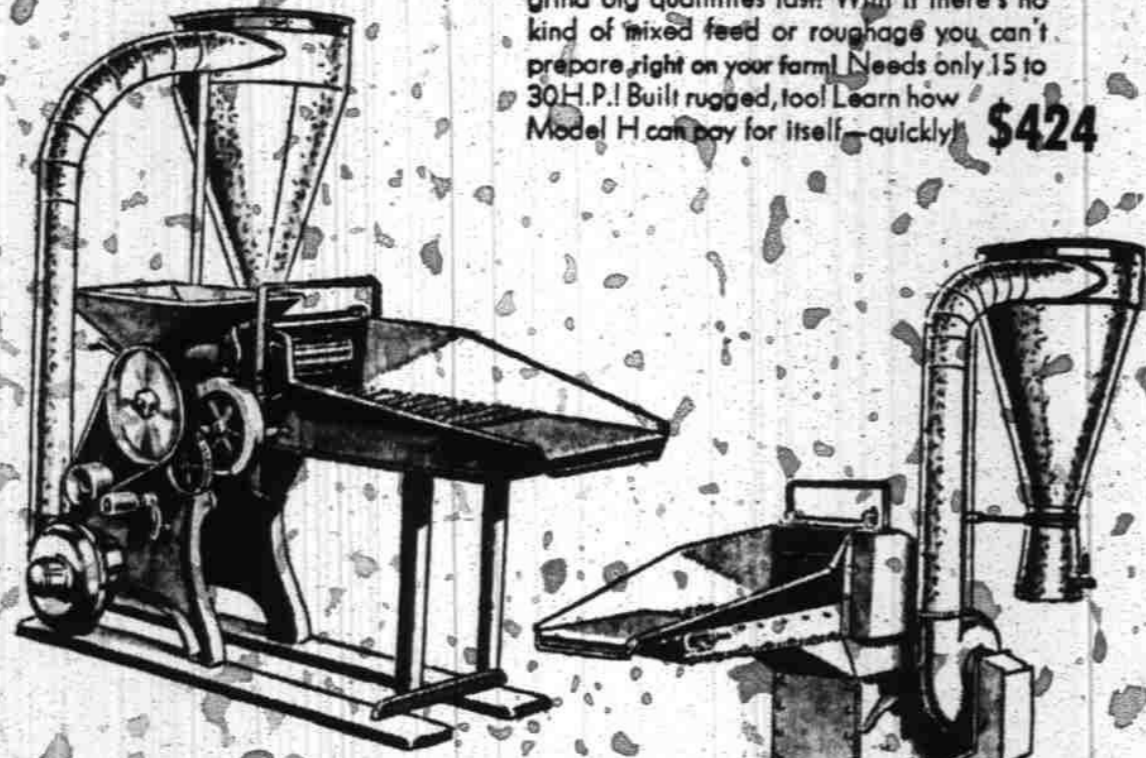
