Let's Have Good Roads.

Again we turn our attention to the road proposition of Schleicher county and as the Honorable commissioners court meets the second Monday in February, we would suggest to the people of this county to have a petition ready to present to the court at this term, asking them to set aside at least two thirds of the public road money then on hand, to be used on the various public roads in this county. The citizens of this county pays this money into the county treasurer for this purpose and why not use it. There is not any thing that needed worse than good roads in Schleicher county, and why not have them. We have the money already collected for that purpose and let's use it, we hear complaints every day about the bad rough roads leading into our city from every direction, so let's try to remedy the matter. Every true citizen that is interested in this county should want good roads, and it appears to us that the court will take no action in this matter unless they are over-whelmingly petitioned by the people, so let's get one out. We don't have any particular road in view to spend money on, but all public highways that is in need of work, and you want and many that does not need some work on them. If the citizens of this county wants good roads they had better get busy and try and get them. This tax is assessed and collected for roads and not to be put out on interest at 3 per cent, if the roads doesn't need the work lets stop the tax, but we are strictly in favor of a road tax if the money is put out on the roads after it is collected. BONDS CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 19 TO 75.

Results of the Election Held Last Saturday to Vote Bonds to Build a \$14,000. School House in El Dorado, Shows the Progressive spirit of El Dorado and Schleicher County People.

As forecasted in THE SUCCESS, the result of the election was an overwhelming majority in favor of the building, the returns showing 75 votes for the building and only 19 votes against it, and THE SUCCESS is confident that in reality, practically, if not all of the votes that were against it, were so, merely from the fact that these voters thought that on account of the stringency in money matters it was the wrong time right now to build. THE SUCCESS is satisfied that they were honest in their view, but as we see it their could be no more opportune time to erect this building, if the people had to go down in their pockets to get this money right at this time, or even any amount of it for the next year or two, we would also say that it is the wrong time, but when we consider that none of this money comes out of the people here until next year and then only the infinitesimal sum of \$2.50 on every thousand dollars worth of property, while on the other hand by building now, we can bring this whole sum of money in from the outside and have it expended here this year when it is so sorely needed by the people who are willing to get out and work on the building, we feel that a better time could not have been selected.

When money in circulation is as scarce as it is at present, that much money taken out of the vaults of the State Treasury where it is lying and doing no good, or from any other outside source, and brought here in cash and expended among our people, will be worth this year, locally, three or four times what it would be worth any ordinary year.

It will enable the people who are willing to work, in case we can cash the bonds as our trustees feel confident they can do, to get out this Summer during the dull time when their crops are laid by and make good wages for themselves and their teams, and they in turn can pay their merchants who will be needing the money badly and thus tide the country over the worst year financially in its history.

As to the few who voted against the building, they should feel that they have done their duty as they saw it, and now that the majority has said by an overwhelming vote that they want the house, as good citizens and good democrats who

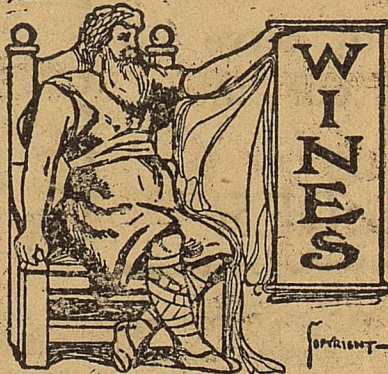
