







POISONING By Dr. Debbie Peaslee

It is wise to use caution in your daily activities to avoid unnecessary exposure to potentially hazardous substances. Prevention is the best antidote for accidental poisoning. Almost any drug or chemical can be hazardous if too much gains entry into the body. This may occur by inhalation, absorption through the skin or eyes, or by swallow-

General precautions include: 1. Keep all medicines, cleaning substances, agricultural supplies, and chemicals out of reach of children - preferably locked away. Put away immediately

2. Purchase medicines in containers with safety caps.

3. Do not transfer toxic substances to drink bottles, glasses or jars.

4. Read safety labels and follow directions for product use. Do not use unlabeled bottles. 5.Dispose of bottles and

expired products properly. 6. Protect skin and eves when

using toxic chemicals. 7. When painting, spraying, or using cleaners, ventilate area

8. Place poisonous houseplants out of reach of children.

9. Store harmful products away from food.

10. Clean the medicine chest egularly and dispose of old medicines.

When you suspect that somesubstance (even if you are unsure doctor, emergency room, or misused.

Poison Control Center Immedlately. Post the numbers near your phone and teach children to call them also. Help may be reached at 1-800-441-0040 or 1-800-392-8548 24 hours daily. To best advise you, they will need to know what substance and how much has been swallowed, as well as how much time has elapsed. Often you will be told to dilute the poison by giving milk or water to drink or remove the product by inducing vomiting with syrup of ipecac, which can be purchased without prescription at any pharmacy. Always contact a doctor or Poison Center before inducing vomiting; however, as this should not be done for caustics, corrosives, or petroleum distillates, or if the person is unconscious or having convulsions.

In cases of inhaled toxins, get the victim to a well-ventilated area away from the polsonous gas. If breathing has stopped, begin artificial respiration. Take care not to expose yourself to the same poison.

Many chemicals that are poisonous to swallow or breathe are also hazardous when absorbed through the skin. Contaminated clothing should be removed, and the skin thoroughly washed with running water and then with soap and water. For eye exposure, flood with lukewarm water for 15 minutes.

Some toys dangerous

Christmas for children around the world, and nowhere but in the U.S. is there such variety. This time of year, stores display thousands of toys made for every age group.

But the Texas Department of Health(TDH), in conjunction with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), works hard to see that children will not get some toys--the one found to be dangerous or even life-threatening.

Throughout the year, CPSC and TDH must inspect and test thousands of kinds of toys made in this coutnry as well as overseas. And each year, they find some toys that contain hazardous materials such as lead

Other toys are poorly designed, with small parts that can be detached or broken from the larger toy and swallowed by


Toys are part of the thrill of young children. Brittle plastic and sharp metal in other toys, and inappropriate labeling for the intended age group, add to the possibility that a child may be hurt or killed.

> In 1987, some 647,000 children less than 15 years old were injured by hazardous or defective toys in the U.S. And 30 of them died. This year, with some reports not yet complete, another seven fatalities occurred between January and Septem-

> So far in 1988, nearly 150 different toys have been found to be unsafe, and their manufacturers were ordered to recall

> Forrest Burnham, chief of the TDH Hazardous Substance Branch, said, 'The majority of toys recalled as safety hazards each


