Enron Office Claimed By Fire

During a severe thunder storm early Tuesday morning, the Enron main office building was engulfed in fire.

The alarm went off at 2:50 a.m. Eldorado Fire Department responded to the fire with all fire trucks. The building was nearly gone by the time they arrived. It was a total loss.

The fire started in the area of the telephone system. It is believed that lightening struck or hit a telephone line and traveled through the line to the telephone system causing the batteries to explode.

Enron's plant station was not burned, only the main office building. The fire trucks returned to Eldorado around 5:30 a.m.



1. Application forms must be completely filled out.

2. Verification of income, termination of income, residence, household composition, and resources is required, if questionable.
