in this month's report are skewed because merchants collected and reported an extra day's worth of sales taxes in February, 1988, which was a leap year.

"We estimated that as much as \$1.9 million in sales tax could have been reported statewide for February 29 last year. One day may not seem like much, but it's enough to throw the numbers off," Bullock said.

Checks totaling \$57.2 million were sent Friday to 902 cities that collect local sales tax at either one or one and one-half percent.

April's checks represent taxes collected by monthly filers in February and reported to the Comptroller's office by March 20.

Eldorado's payment for this period was \$3,736.41, compared to \$3,881.78 at this time last year, a decrease 3.49 percent. However, 1989 payments to date are \$21,526.01 which is an increase of 15.98 percent over 1988 payment at this same City Council meeting, the
