

## Heavy rains inundate area

Torrential rains swamped much of Schleicher County on Thursday and Friday of last week. Totals ranging from 8 to 11 inches were reported across the County as Tropical Storm Erin deluged Central and Southwest Texas. The storm, which popped up suddenly in the central Gulf of Mexico, came ashore near Victoria before hooking to the right and slowly churning over much of central and west Texas. The storm eventually made its way to Oklahoma where it continued to rain itself out.

Here in Schleicher County, officials closed roads and monitored low-water crossings as a slow and steady rain brought totals of an inch per hour.

Sheriff David Doran and Emergency Services Coordinator Jerry Jones kept a watchful eye on the storm as it wobbled slowly across the area and appeared at times to stall out. The tropical depression eventually hooked to the right and headed northeast, but a coma-shaped tail continued to dump rain over and area stretching from Comstock, to Eldorado and northward to Wall and Ballinger.

Perhaps the most significant damage was discovered Saturday morning when residents of northern Schleicher County reported the surface had been washed off a highway bridge on County Road 302 (Old San Angelo Highway).

Water had clearly crested the bridge by several feet, leaving dead sheep and goats hanging high in nearby trees. Fortunately, there were no human

"We really got lucky on this one," Sheriff Doran commented. "We had draws up and running across the county and were fortunate that nobody tried to drive off in one of them."

The storm wasn't completely without incident, however. Frequent lightning strikes last Friday evening fried computers and electrical components at several businesses in downtown Eldorado.

Meanwhile, Mayor John Nikolauk explained this week that the City of Eldorado's landfill was swamped by the rains. The facility is closed as crews work to remove the water.

## Former church members may testify in Jeffs trial

Richard Holm and Jethro Barlow, former members of the Fundamentalist Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, will be allowed to testify in the upcoming trial against Warren Steed Jeffs, self-proclaimed prophet and leader of the 10,000 member congregation.

Fifth District Judge James L. Shumate ruled Monday that the two men will be allowed to tell their stories during the trial, stories that the prosecution hopes will shed light on the inner-workings of the polygamous sect. Members of the FLDS church consider themselves to be the true followers of Joseph Smith, the founder of the Mormon religion. The broke away from the mainstream Mormon church decades ago when the mother church banned the practice of polygamy.

While Jeffs isn't accused of polygamy, he is charged with using his position as church leader to force an underage girl into a polygamous marriage with her older cousin. The state of Utah also alleges that Jeffs exercised his power as the girl's spiritual leader to compel her to have sexual relations with her new husband, despite the fact that she voiced an unwillingness to do so. For that, the State of Utah has accused Jeffs of committing Rape as an Accomplice.

The testimony of Holm and Barlow is of interest because the men, now excommunicated from the FLDS once held positions of power and authority inside the secretive FLDS community, a fact that prosecutors hope will give jurors some insight into how the patriarchal society functions.

For his part, Richard Holm was once a successful businessman and loyal FLDS member with two wives. One of his church responsibilities was to provide transportation for former prophet Rulon Jeffs.

However, when the elder prophet died, Holm says, Rulon Jeffs' son, Warren Jeffs, seized power. Holm found himself increasingly on the outside of Jeffs' circle of power culminating with the day he learned he had been kicked out of the church. To make matters worse, Holm says his wives and children were taken away from him and reassigned to his brother. Holm was also forced to vacate his home which sat on land owned by the United Effort Plan Trust, the one-time financial arm of the FLDS Church.

Jethro Barlow was an accountant who oversaw a some of the financial dealings of the FLDS Church and the UEP Trust. He, too, was excommunicated from the church.

Lawyers representing Warren Jeffs had hoped to prevent Holm and Barlow from testifying, even at a preliminary hearing.

## New traffic, criminal laws set to go into effect September 1

Notable traffic and criminal laws that go into effect on September 1 (unless noted otherwise) include the following:

HB 84, known as Katie's Law, requires drivers 85 years of age and above to pass a vision test to have their driver license renewed. Licenses will be valid for two years instead of six. Drivers age 79 and older are not allowed to renew their driver

licenses electronically. HB 586 prohibits a driver who is issued a

speeding ticket and found guilty of driving at a speed higher than 95 miles per hour from taking a driving safety class to dismiss the ticket.

SB 369 prohibits the use of blurring or reflective matter on a license plate that significantly impairs the readability of the state name and license plate numbers and letters; prohibits the use of material or an apparatus that alters or obscures one-half or more of the state name;

# First responders: The spirit of volunteerism

Texas's earliest settlers appreciated the wide open spaces of our vast landscape, but were quick to band together for the common good when an emergency arose. Nothing brought out that cooperative spirit more rapidly than the specter of fire.

In the smallest communities, citizens organized bucket brigades on a moment's notice. In those days, firefighting equipment might consist only of shovels, water containers and anything handy to smother the flames.

In 1845, a fire in San Augustine enveloped several buildings, but the hotel "was saved by the indefatigable exertions of the citizens who covered the roof with carpets and blankets and kept the front

deluged with water thrown from windows."

In Houston, during the same era, authorities organized a paid company of firemen. But any major fire brought out an eager corps of civilian volunteers nonetheless.

Today, that spirit of volunteerism still thrives across Texas. Of 1,800 fire departments in the state, some 1,450 are all-volunteer, and another 250 combine paid and volunteer staff. These citizen-run operations cover the vast majority of Texas's 261,797 square miles.

Put another way, two-thirds of the 60,000 firefighters in Texas are men and women willing to volunteer their time and risk the dangers of emergency service to help their neighbors.

Recently, rural firefighters have been busy fighting fast-moving grassfires. Texas State Forester James Hull believes we have just passed the midpoint of a 30-year dry or drought cycle, vastly increasing fire risk across the state, especially in rural areas, where the dry conditions of 2006 were particularly perilous.

With a few other central U.S. states, Texas has had above-average rainfall so far in 2007—reducing fire risk in many areas. But, as residents of East Texas were reminded again this summer, danger is a constant companion for firefighters at all times.

Earlier this month, two volunteer firemen from Noonday, Texas—Captain Kevin Williams and Austin Cheek—made the ultimate sacrifice while battling a house fire in Flint, Texas. Two other volunteers were injured while trying to save their lives.

In June, Nacogdoches Fire Captain Joe Ed Ivy, a career fireman, died in Houston during a high-rise training exercise. Capt. Ivy's brother and cousin also work for the Nacogdoches Fire Department.

While their communities were shocked by these losses, it should be some small comfort to their families that these men died serving others.

In recent years, and especially since Sept. 11, 2001, the federal government has assumed a greater role in local emergency preparedness. Although the danger of terrorism is likely greater in urban areas, we have learned from Katrina and other disasters that after-effects often spill over into suburban and rural areas. Emergency personnel in all regions must be prepared and up to date.

In 2001, Congress created the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) program aimed at as-

in the country.

Worrell is always thinking. He keeps a journal with him all the time. If he sees something at a restaurant that intrigues him, he'll get out his pen and write something. Or he might ask for crayons and do a drawing or design. If he stacks all the journals he has kept over the years, the stack would be taller than he is.

Bill Worrell not only sculpts. He also paints. # State honors WWII vets with Capitol monument

AUSTIN - Texas veterans of World War II are now honored with a new monument located near the east

entrance of the Texas Supreme Court Building in the northwest quadrant of the Capitol grounds. Thousands of people attended the Aug. 15 dedication, the 62nd anniversary of



the victory over Japan and the official end of the war.

More than 830,000 Texans served in the armed forces in the war, and 22,000 were killed.

Donations from corporations, associations, foundations and individuals paid for the 17-foot-tall, 22-ton monument.

#### **TxDOT** delivers report on bridges

Is a bridge you've been using for years sturdy enough to deserve your confidence? Are you sure?

The Interstate 35-West bridge collapse in Minnesota on Aug. 1 made people wonder.

Soon after the event, Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst asked the Texas Department of Transportation to produce a report on the status of Texas bridges.

TxDOT responded with a 92-page report released Aug. 16, saying 4 percent of the state's 50,000 bridges are listed as structurally deficient. However, the first line of the report says "All bridges open to traffic on Texas public roads in the State of Texas are safe."

The report, readily available at www.txdot.gov, includes a list of structurally deficient bridges.

A few points made by TxDOT:

• "Structurally deficient" is a term the Federal Highway Administration uses to classify and prioritize bridges for federal funding.

• Structurally deficient bridges receive priority for limited rehabilitation on replacement funds from the federal government.

• Bridges that are unsafe or present an imminent public danger are closed to traffic.

• Of the state's bridges classified as structurally deficient, 445 are on the state highway system and 1,579 are off-system structures.

• Some 282 bridges classified as structurally deficient are currently under contract to be fixed or replaced.

• Another 1,303 structurally deficient bridges are under development as part of the state transportation plan.

• The remaining 439 structurally deficient bridges are not scheduled for rehabilitation or replacement, and no funding has been identified for them, TxDOT said.

#### Progress report on schools is in

The Texas Education Agency reports 86 percent of school districts and 79 percent of schools met the state's 2007 standards for "Adequate Yearly Progress."

The state standards tie into the federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.

Public schools and districts tested students in kindergarten through 12th grade. At least 60 percent of the students had to pass the reading/language test and at least 50 percent had to pass the math exam.

Attendance and graduation figures also figured into the calculations. Schools that do not meet the state's Adequate Yearly Progress standards two years in a row are placed in an improvement program.

## S.C.I.S.D. announces policy for providing free and reduced meals for children

Schleicher County I.S.D. announces its policy for providing free and reduced meals for children served under the national School Lunch and School breakfast programs. Each school and/or the central office have a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any interested party.

The household size and income criteria identified below will be used to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price benefits. Children from households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Foster children who are the legal responsibility of a welfare agency or court may also be eligible for benefits regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside. Eligibility for the foster child is based on the child's income.

Application forms are being distributed to all households with a letter informing households of the availability of free and reduced-price meals for their children. Applications also are available at the principal's office in each school. To apply for free and reduced-price meals, households must fill out the application and return it to the school. Applications may be submitted anytime during the school year. The information households provide on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eli-

gibility and verification of data. The school decision may make a request either orally officials may verify applications at any time or in writing to Food Service Director Ima during the school year.

For school officials to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price benefits, households receiving food stamps or TANF only have to list their child's name and food stamp or TANF case number. An adult household member must sign the applica-

Households that do not list a food stamp or TANF case number must list the names of all household members, the amount and source of the income received by each household member and the social security number of the adult household member who signs the application. If the adult who signs the application does not have a social security number the household member must indicate that a social security number is not available by writing the word "NONE". An adult household member must sign the

Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price meal policy, The Food service Director will review applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the ruling of the official may wish to discuss the decision with the reviewing official on an informal basis. Parents wishing to make a formal appeal for a hearing on the

Households that list a food stamp or TANF case number must report when the household no longer receives these benefits. Other households approved for benefits based on income of information must report increases in household income of over \$50 per month or \$600 per year and decrease in household size. Also, if a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size increases, the household should contact the school. Such changes may make the children of the household eligible for benefits if household's income falls at or below the level shown below.




"These grants will help rural residents and businesses upgrade energy infrastructure and make other energy efficiency improvements," Johanns said. "The rising cost of energy can challenge economic growth and opportunity. These grants are another example of how USDA works to help rural communities overcome economic obstacles and create opportunity."

Funds may be used to acquire, construct, extend, upgrade or otherwise improve energy generation, transmission or distribution facilities serving communities in which the average residential cost for home energy exceeds 275 percent of the national average.

Grants are available to individuals, businesses, non-profit entities, states, local governments and federally recognized Indian tribes. Grants may not be used to pay utility bills or to purchase fuel. Also, grant funds may not be used for the sole benefit of the applicant.
