Vocationa and teccnicial programs already are suffering from
faculty shortages faculty shortages and outdated dequipment.
In the worst recession since World War II, our need for In the worst recession since World War 111 , our need for
graduate engineers continues to outpace supply. Yet, colleges and universitits repert from 2,000 to 2,500 vacancies in engineering
faculty. Of more than 200 training facilities surveyed by the faculty. Of more than 200 training facilities surveyed by the
American Vocational Association, 44 percent of the technical programs and 52 percent of the technical and industrial programs
were using tools and equipment that is more than 10 years old. This presents a gloomy picture. In time, I believe the free market process would resolve the situation, but 1 don't think we
can afford to wait. With the right incentives, I think that busines and education could pool their resources to solve these problems
more rapidly. 1 have introduced a package of three bills, the Bentsen Skilled
Worker Training Proposal, which will provide the incellive to reduce these anticipated skills shortages withen a big feder spending program.

ax credits for lending engineers to teach at colleges and univer sities and for making grants so theses schools can hirire more facul-
y. Tax credits also would be given to employers who encourage their workers to participate in skills training programs. Tax deductions would be expanded for busingssess that donate
