Former All-American To Speak At All-SportsBanquet

The annual All-Sports Ban-
quet has been set for May 4 and quet has been set for May 4 and
former All.American and Texas
Hall of Famer Hall of Famer Donny Anderson
will be the main speaker at the

Anderson was born in Bor-
ger. He attended Stinnett High School from 1957-1960, where he was a four-year letterman in
three sports--football, basket.
ball, and track
He was named All-State, AllAmerican, and All. Southern for
his performances in football in
19
Anderson then attended
Texas Tech University where he
was named the "Golden Palo. was named the "Golden Palo-
mino with the All-Amer touch'", for he was said to be
one of those rare athletes who
lived up tohis nickname: he was
a "horse. a "horse" when carrying a "golden".
Anderson holds nine indivi-
dual football records at Texas Tech: longest kick-off return, longest run, most passes caugh down passes caught, most pas ses caught in a career, single season scoring, single season
kick-off
return,
and
kick-off return career record. choice of the Houston Oilers
and the Green Bay Packers. He chose the contract he was the Packers and created inter the Packers and created inter-
national headlines in 1965 when he signed the richest rookie contract in the game's history.
Sports writers and fans mar Sports writers and fans mar-
velled about how a "kid" from the West Texas prairies could command a contract that called for such startling figures esti-
mated to be anywhere from mated to
$\$ 400,000$ to $\$ 600,000$.
Beginning in 1966 and con-
tinuing for six tinuing for six years, Anderson
was a standout runner. recaiver and punter as the racker captured Super Bowls I and II. A $6^{\prime} 3^{\prime \prime}, 200 \mathrm{lb}$. left-hander Anderson was voted the Pack.
er's MVP in 1968 and 1969 by his teammate.
He has been induicted in the
Texas Tech Hall of Fane the Green Bay Packers Hall of
Game, and the Texas Pater Fame, and the Texas Panhandl
Hall of Fame.

Anderson now resides in
Dallas, where he is an investor and own his own insurance

business, the Donny Anderson Insurance. His wife. Karen, is a
high fashion model for Neiman Marcus. They have two child ren, son Blake, and daughter Ashiley Kesh.

ing legalities and agenda re-
quirements.
by Kathy e posted 72 hours before the meeting. listed on the agenda, one must call the business office efore noon on the Wednesday ing. As with the City, if no action is required, it is not
necessary to be listed on the necessary to be listed on the
agenda. However, if action is necessary or a written complaint is to be presented, one must be listed on the agenda.
School officials do suggest. when issueing a complaint a bout a teacher or school problem, that students and parents
first meet with the teacher. If first meet with the teacher. If
theeting does not bring about required results, it is
suggested that they then meet suggested that they then meet
with the principal. Likewise if with the principal. Likewise if
that meeting is deemed unsuccessful, the parents should then meet with the superinten-
dent, All of the meetings should dent, All of the meetings shoyld
be noted before bringing the problem to the board's attention ltems that do not appear on
the agenda may be discussed, but no action (or vote) cas be taken on the item unle appears on the agenda.
The council or board trustees may go into executive session during the meeting under the provisions of section
2 -g of Article $4252-17$ of RCS of Texas to discuss employment, reassignment of duties, disci-
pline or dismissal

cerning any other matter, and any final action, decision or vote
in regard to such matters con. in regard to such matters con-
sidered will be made in open sidered
session Although it is certainly the right of every citizen to issue
complaints to board and complaints to board and council
members outside of the meeting such complaints issued at the meeting.
If you are intersted cerned about the running of town and/or school, attend these meetings. If you have a
written complaint or would like the board to take action on a
request, be certain to be listed request, be certain to be listed
on the agenda. Don't ask these request illegally.
And above all, get involved!
The future of your town and the The future of your town and the
education of your children depend on your input to the
meetings. It is much better to be informed of possible actions
to be taken at the meetings and be able to voice your opinion before-hand, than wait until
action has been taken and then action has been to
voice your opinion It is much easier for these
officials to make their decisions officials to make their decisions
when they know how their when they know how their
constituents feel before, than try and second-guess and per haps make a decission that the
majority of the constituents do majority of
not support
