Terry Coffee Hired To Head Tiger Gridders

Terry Coffee was hired last Thursday evening as the head coach and athletic director for Groom Schools. Louis Ruthardt made the motion to hire Coffee after President Pat Weinheimer asked the board if they plan to stay with three coaches? The vote to hire Coffee was unanimous.

Coffee told board members, "I appreciate your vote of confidence and ask

for your support and 100 percent backing for all the coaches."

Coffee then explained to board members that coaches would like parents to air their complaints with coaches first and honor the "chain of command" at the school from coaches to administration before making gripes known to school board members. Coffee said the board should be a final resort

and says "We would like to be confronted first." He also said that most problems could be resolved in that manner.

Coffee was also hired in a separate motion to serve as athletic director and given an 11 month salary. Coffee also told board members that all coaching schedules would remain the same and no changes were planned.

Groom And Vicinity Receives Two Inches In Past Three Days

If you've never been caught in a hurricane, weather conditions Saturday night in Groom will probably be as close as you'll ever want to come to being in one.

High winds tore limbs from trees and spread leaf and limb debris but for the most part, damage was only minor. Signs at L.A. Motel and Stop N Shop had glass portions blown out and the press box at the football field was tilted a bit in the wind but otherwise damage was

limited to vegetation. The press box might have been a total loss but it was supported by a light pole behind it.

Luckily, crops fared well in the storm and should benefit from the moisture. Area elevator personnel estimate that harvest could begin by the end of the week if conditions remain dry.

Winds were estimated to be in excess of 80 mph. An inch and .10 was measured from Saturday's storm and another half inch of rain fell Sunday.

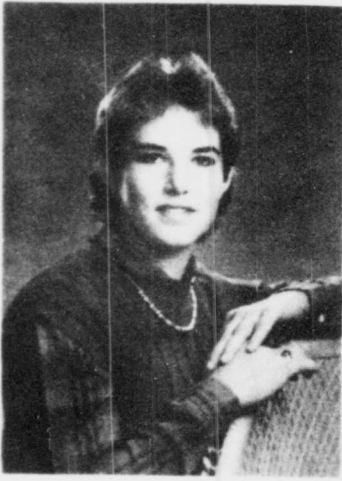

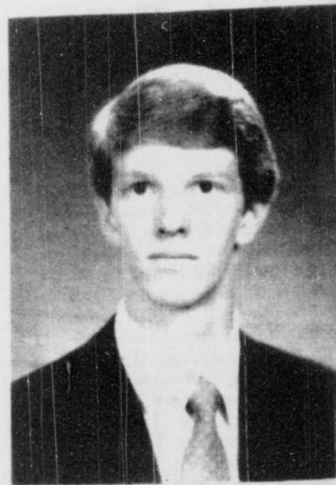

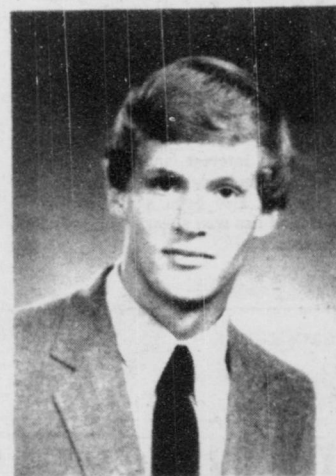
Lindy is the third ranking student in her graduating class. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Kotara.

Foster Whaley Speaks To Young At Heart Club

State Representative Foster Whaley was the guest speaker Thursday night at the Senior Citizen's Center.

Mr. Whaley, who was first elected in 1978, represents a district containing 93,000 constituents from Pampa to Lubbock.

His primary topic was the useless expenditure of money and the introduction of needless laws by the legislature. He said, "Over 4,000 bills are introduced by the legislature and people don't really need any of them." As examples of wasteful spending, he mentioned aid to parochial schools and government subsidies to the arts. Concerning the latter he said, "It is a welfare program for the socially and economically elite."

In his remarks pertaining to senior citizens, Whaley said he is against the concept of the silver-haired legislature. He said, "It will merely provide a liaison between senior citizens and the legislature and I think I can do that." He said most voters are over the age of 50 and don't need to lobby for

special favors. He added, "If voters will just pressure their representatives not to vote for many of the measures being considered, spending can be held down."

He did express praise for several local programs for the elderly including the Community Action program in McLean and the Meals on Wheels project.

When asked if he could assist the Senior Citizen's Center in obtaining money for improvements, he said, "The state will be \$1.3 billion in the red during the next session and will have to limit spending. I would probably oppose using state money to assist in making improvements to the center." However, he said that the money could probably be obtained from a private source, such as the M.K. Brown Foundation. He said he would provide any assistance he could in getting such a grant for the center.

After Mr. Whaley's remarks, he was invited to play dominos. About 25 people were present.
