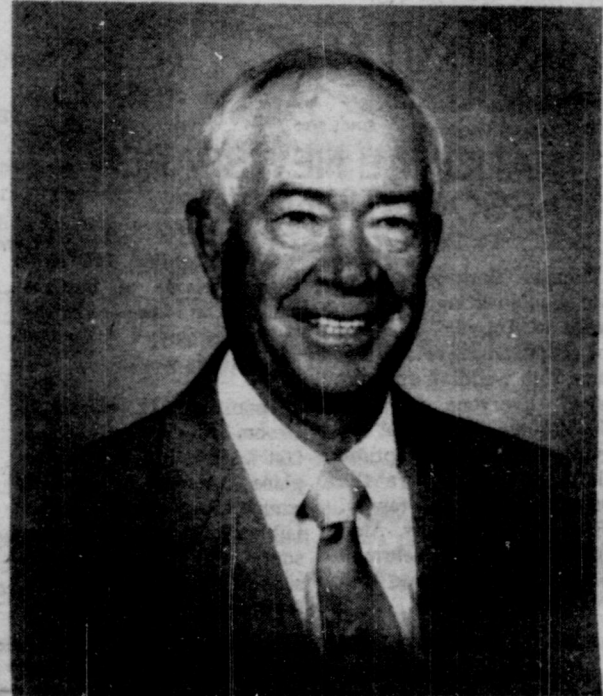
## Burgin Services Held

SOS meets today (Feb. 26) at the fellowship hall of the Church of Christ for a noon luncheon.

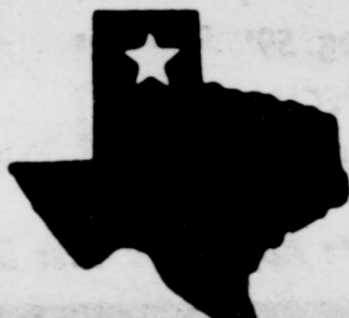

### County Considers Half-Cent Tax Option

Carson County Commissioners met Monday approving depositories throughout the county. State National Bank of Groom will receive funds deposited for Precincts 1 and 2. Precinct 3 and 4 funds will be deposited at First Bank and Trust in White Deer. The county General Fund will be deposited at First National Bank in Panhandle.

Eddy England was approved for full time employment with county on a request from Commissioner R.J. Britten. England will assume his duties on March 1.

The local option county sales tax adopted by the legislature was discussed. This is a sales tax which could be implemented by a county to according to proponents of the option, lessen the amount of ad valorem or property taxes in a county. "From all indications this would lower the property tax by less than one percent," said Judge Jay Roselius, "if the county should agree to accept the option."

In other action several projects in Precinct 4 were outlined and all agreed that the work should done on a priority basis.

Also Precinct 4 received an the go ahead for purchase of a belly dump trailer and end dump trailer at a cost of \$4,100 and trade of a loader.

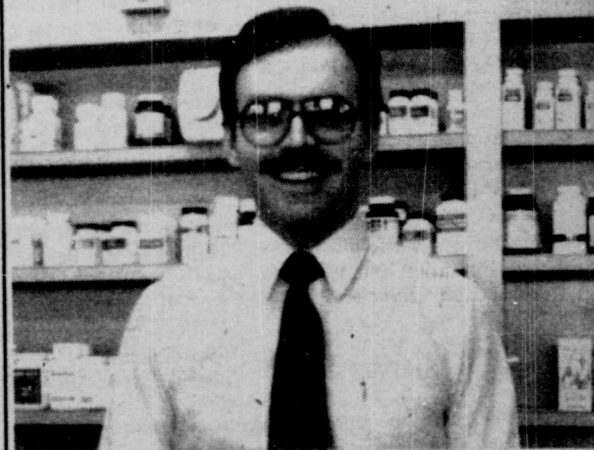

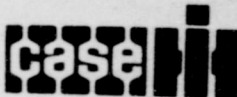

Filing has closed for candidacy in the City elections which will be held on April 4. This year, eight names will appear on the ballot, two running for Mayor and six for City Council.

Applying for the job of Mayor will be two local businessmen, George Green and Bill Thomas. Green is a salesman employed with a chemical company and is currently serving on the Council. Thomas is the Administrator of the McLean Care Center, a business formerly owned by the Thomas family.

On the council, three seats are up for election: two full-term positions, currently held by George Green and Miro Pagan, and one unexpired term currently filled by Jerry Cook. Cook was appointed to the position last year after the resignation of Brian Pohlmeier. Cook is a

math teacher at McLean High School and also owns his own plumbing business. He is the only council member up for re-election who announced his candidacy to retain his seat. He is being challenged for the position by Jake Bible, a retired pipe fitter.

Four candidates will be competing for the two full-term seats. They are: Mike Harkins, an employee of

Chevron, USA; Dale Glass, who works for Nash Oil Co. and delivers newspapers; Gerald Reynolds, a construction worker; and Betty Louise Turner, retired, a former employee at the factory.

Absentee balloting for the election will begin on March 16.

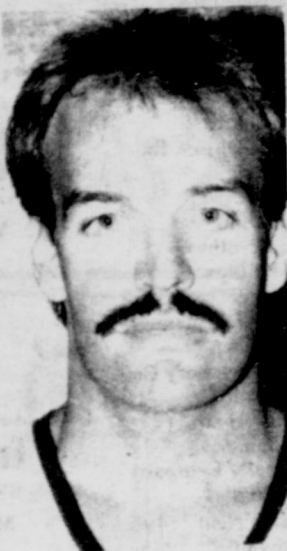
In the race for School Board, there are still no candidates. Two seats, those held by Jake Hess II and

Conference as a freshman and first-team All-Conference, All-Regional and TABC All-Star recognition while a sophomore.

During his first year at WT, Woods led the team in field-goal shooting with a .485 percentage and he averaged 5 points, 2.2 rebounds and 1.2 assists per game.

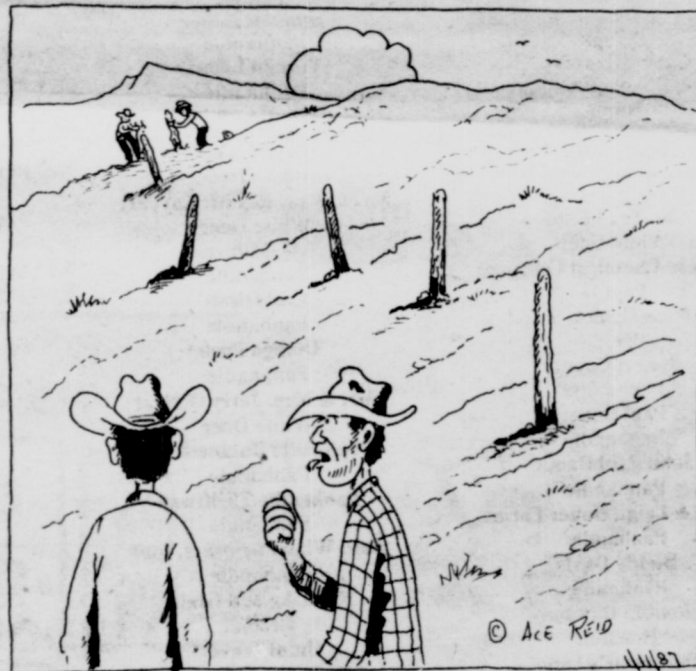
Woods is majoring in computers.

The Bufs have now entered into post-season play and were scheduled to play Texas A&I on Tuesday night.

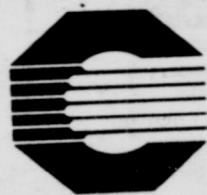

**Parents Important to Learning Says Principal**

Alanreed School Principal Billy Bob Adams reports that the Alanreed PTO for February was cancelled due to a lack of participation. As few as twenty minutes a day spent working with your child on reading or math can make a big difference in achievement. The purpose of these articles is to help you become more efficient at facilitating your child's at-home learning. With the information in these articles, and just 20 minutes a day, you can help make your child's learning more effective. Time is the key to how much and how fast kids learn. Educational research has shown that a positive relationship exists between how long a child spends engaged in a learning task and how much he learns.

This finding is not surprising but it has some rather important implications regarding your child's learning. If a child is to make the most of his educational experience, it is vital that quality learning time occurs at home as well as at school. There simply aren't enough minutes in a school day to cover all of the information your child needs to acquire to function in a rapidly changing society. Truly, parents and teachers must become partners in learning in order to maximize learning experiences for all children. The parent must supplement what is learned at school and to encourage sound study habits and routines. On a greater scale than ever before, the parent must assume an active role in children's education. Not only will your child benefit from this active stance, but you will experience a new sense of accomplishment with each step forward your child advances. Quality time spent together can bring new meaning to family relationships.

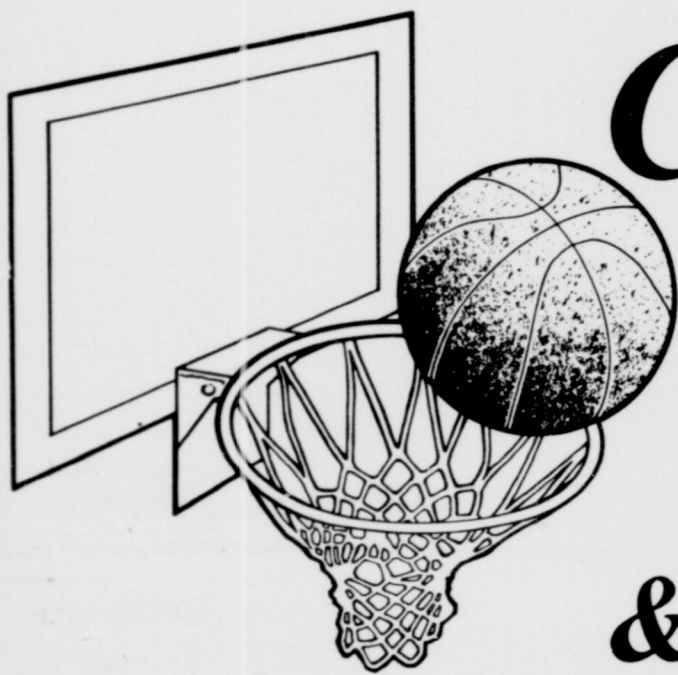

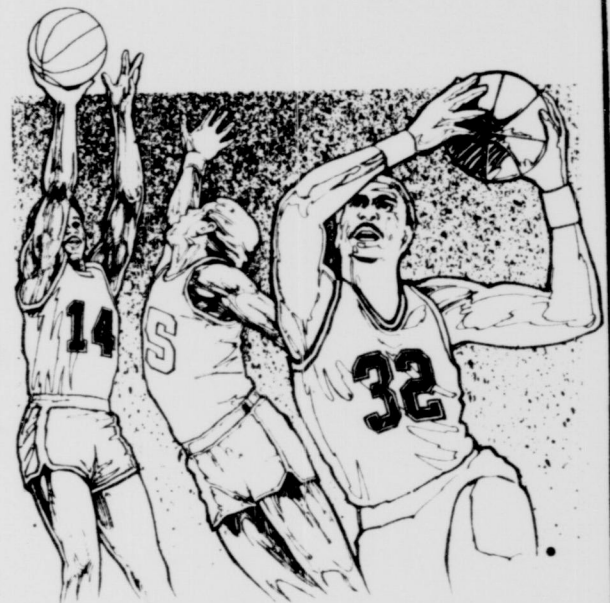
