An orientation for all organist in the community will be scheduled during the month of June.

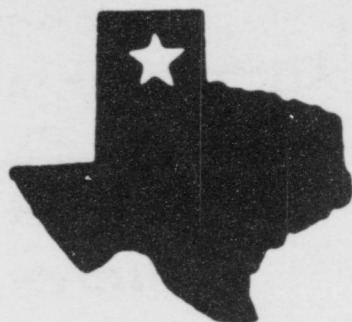
The Church wishes to invite and welcome everyone in the Groom area to the dedication of the organ on Sunday, May 21 at 3:00 p.m.

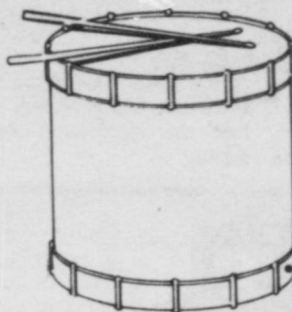

Jeremy Britten, son of Jerry Britten, was glad to be back at school Thursday. He almost didn't make it that day - or any other.

Jeremy, a 15-year-old freshman at Panhandle High School, spent Sunday afternoon through Wednesday morning in hospitals. He was recovering from an asthma-inspired respiratory arrest on Sunday that sent shock waves through this school choir and almost left him dead in the mountains on New Mexico.

So, with Roberts giving mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and Whittenberg massaging Jeremy's chest, the two began what seemed like an eternal task of bringing the lifeless boy back to consciousness.

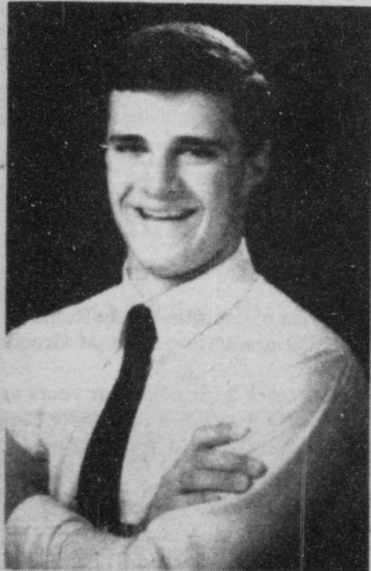

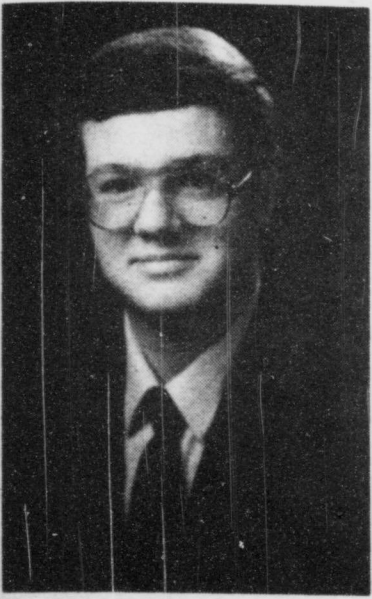

Charles Allen Britten, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Amos Britten will receive a diploma at graduation exercises on May 26.

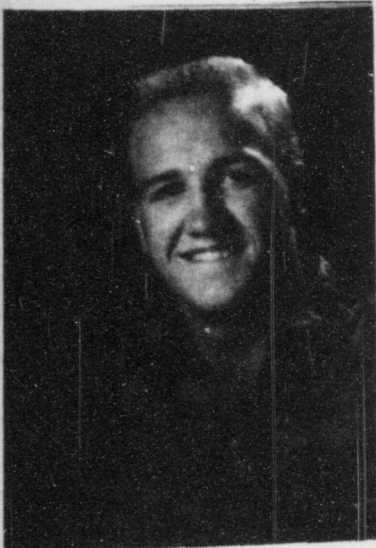

Family Celebrates Gold

On May 5, 1989, the youngest of the seven native born Texas children of the late Mr. and Mrs. Benjamin Atchley Franklin, of Groom, joined her six brothers and sisters in celebration of a golden wedding anniversary. All seven of the Franklin children, three sons and four daughters are still living and there have been no divorces for a combined total of 370 married years.

The Guinness Book of World Records will list the Franklin family in their next issue.

Including information like the first date, the honeymoon, the first car, war rations, family vacations and the first television, family members filled out questionnaires to preserve their memories of what married life was like.

The first of the Franklin children to marry was Virginia Mae Franklin who wed William (Pat) Alton Vance on March 4, 1928 in Groom. Vance was a telegrapher for the Rock Island Lines and the couple moved 26 times in the first year of their marriage.

Next in line at the altar was sister Mary Cleo who married Ross Nix on November 19, 1932. The first home they purchased was in Groom at 207 2nd Street which they have completely remodeled and still live in today.

Next to marry was brother Williard Benjamin Franklin. He married Opa! Mae Davis

on May 5, 1934 in the parlor of the parsonage of the First Baptist Church in Pampa. They spent their honeymoon in Erick, Okla. visiting with married sister Virgie.

Sister Gladys Irene and Irl Marvin Smith met in the 1920's at the Methodist Church Epworth League meetings. They were good friends for many years and had their first "date" in 1930. They were married on June 16, 1935 in Claude. The couple got their first phone in 1936 and the number was 1510.

Brother William Orville married Mae Louise Lewis on March 12, 1936. He gave his bride-to-be her wedding rings in a five pound box of chocolates on Christmas. During the war years, they remember that shoe coupons were hard to come by for the children and a gentleman named Henry Kolb shared his coupons in exchange for some free meals.

Brother Perry George was next in line to tie the knot and on September 11, 1937 he married 16 year old Ruth Naomi Smith in the parsonage of the First Baptist Church in Groom. The first car the couple owned was a 1932 Dodge that cost \$25.00.

Sister Hazel Corrine and husband Everrett Richard Butler were married on May 5, 1939 and were honored by a reception in celebration of their 50th wedding anniversary by their three children on May 6, 1989.

Regular exercise seems to stop bone loss and may even increase bone density, a study at Tufts University found. Postmenopausal women who walked briskly 45 minutes a day, four times a week, had a 3 percent increase in density in a year; sedentary control group lost 10 percent.
