4-H Members Compete

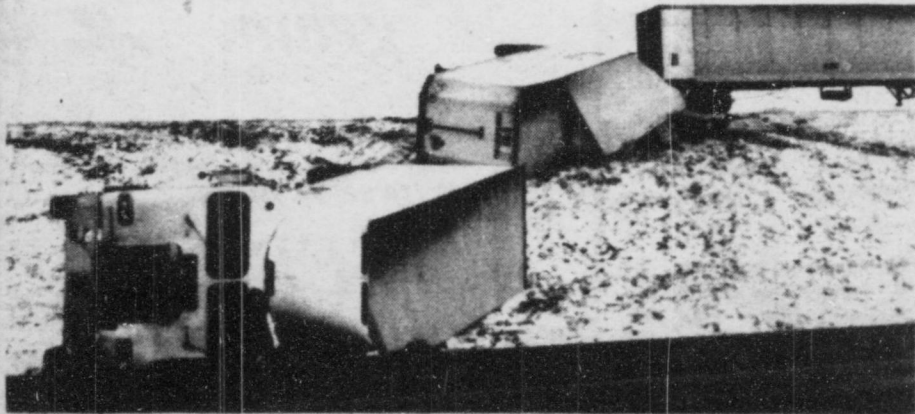
Carson County 4-H members competed for top honors at the 1988 County 4-H Favorite Foods Show on

Two men from Indiana were trapped in the wrecked truck for about 45 minutes. The Jaws of Life were used to extricate the men from the truck. The extrication crew was headed by Fire Chief Tony Treadwell with several members and some helpful

bystanders, David Britten, Lynn Pool, and Kenneth Payton transported the two men by ambulance to Coronado Community Hospital where they were reported doing well. The fire department and ambulance responded to a wreck Sunday morning west of Conway. A truck had rolled over a car. Upon arrival no further services were needed. Claude Ambulance had responded and transported the injured parties to Amarillo.

Wind Damage Reported

The winds of March held no comparison to the gale-like turbulence Tuesday, November 15. Weather forecasters attributed the change to the leading edge of a cold front which dumped snow from the Canadian border to the Texas Panhandle. Wind speeds were reported to be 35-45 mph, with gusts nearing the 65 mph mark in several locations.

Slight damage was noted locally. Debris of tree limbs,

leaves and roofing material were sent spiraling in tornadic-like motion. Two fires were reported on that same day. One was at the 6666 Ranch, which Groom firefighters assisted and a fire more local was reported at the Clarence Merrick place. A fallen power line started the fire. Two local fireman received minor injuries; Melvin Wills and John Allen Homen.

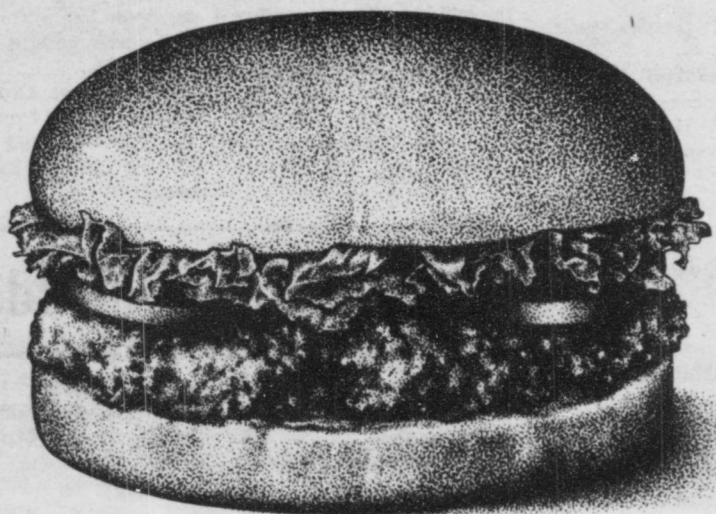

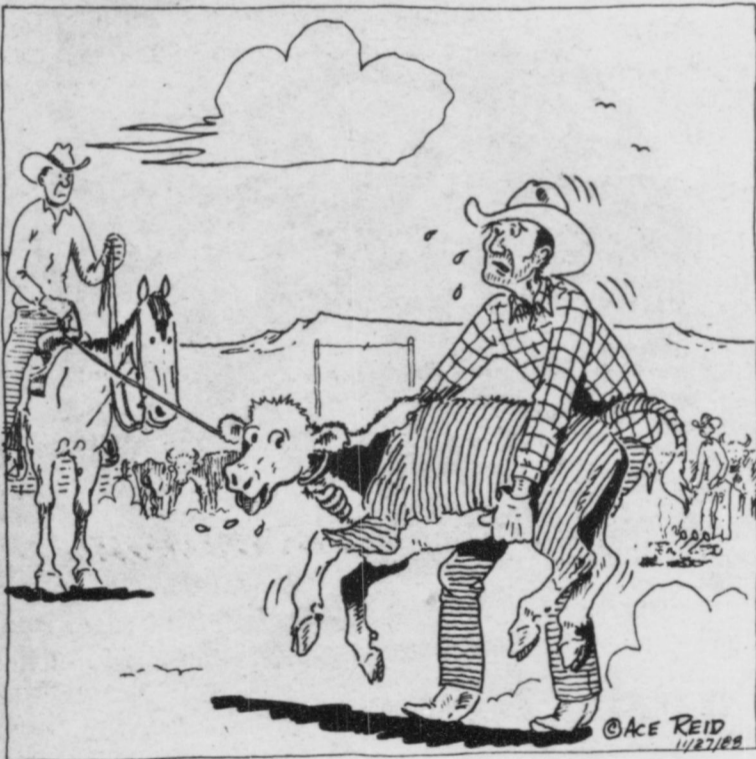

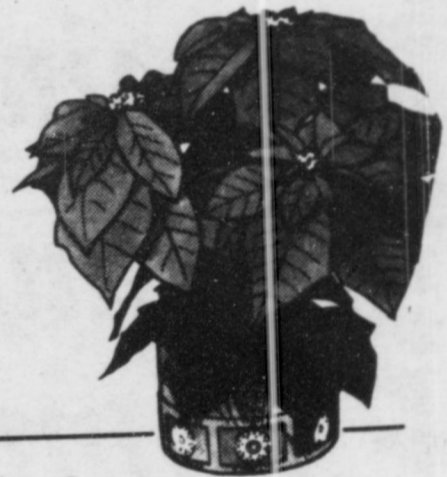
