Miss McLean Crowning Saturday

Semi-Finalists

Coca-Cola officials were proud to announce on Jan. 30 that 17-year-old Dollie L. Haynes of McLean was named a semi-finalist in the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation Competition.

Dollie, a competitor at McLean High, was among 1,499 other semi-finalist nation wide, selected from a group of more than 50,000 applicants.

Dollie is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Haynes of McLean. She must now submit a comprehensive essay, recommendations and an official school transcript. If selected as one of 150 finalists, she will advance to the National Competition in Atlanta, Ga.

Semi-finalists were presented a \$50 savings bond in recognition of their achievement. These bonds were presented Jan. 25 at the Amarillo Division office.

At the National Competition, each of the 150 Coca-Cola Scholars named as finalists will compete for designation as a National Scholar or a Regional Scholar. The 50 National Scholars will receive renewable awards of \$5,000 per year totaling \$20,000 over a four year undergraduate program. The remaining 100 finalists will be designated as Regional Scholars and receive one year non-renewable awards of \$1,000. Students may use their awards at any accredited college or university of their choice.

More than \$1 million in scholarship money will be disbursed annually by the fourth year of the merit based program.
