County Budget Hearing Set

A copy of Carson County's 1990-91 proposed budget is on file in the Clerk's office for residents to view before attending a ten o'clock hearing on the proposal Monday morning, Aug. 27. Commissioners in their Tuesday, Aug. 14, session discussed the budget at length and will act on it after the hearing is held.

In other business of the Aug. 14th session, Judge Roselius reviewed information concerning the County Health Insurance program and the Court discussed various programs and plans of other providers.

It was also noted that County Auditor Agnes Bell has been reappointed to a 2-year term of office by District Judge John Forbis. Mrs. Bell's term began August 1, 1990.

Ray Cliver was appointed the County's Veterans Service officer to the local Veterans Land Board. His appointment filled the vacancy created by the death of C.L. Sterling. Other members are Grady Milton and Jack Ramey.

The commissioners approved a proposal to clean up property at 509 Main in Skellytown.

Groom School Board Hires Ralph Ellis As Band Director

Ralph Kerbow Ellis was employed by the Groom ISD Board of Trustees to serve as music teacher and band director during the Tuesday, August 14 meeting. Ellis will draw the state minimum salary of \$18,140 plus \$700 for classroom increment, for a bachelor's degree, plus \$3,000 band supplement which equals \$21,840 contract; and further, to make available housing valued at \$300 monthly for payment of \$100 each month.

Ellie Peebles submitted her resignation at Aide I and was accepted by the board. Leslie Crowell was hired by the board to replace Peebles at a salary of \$4,492.86 (step 0) and as a certified teacher at state minimum \$18,140 plus \$700. Classroom increment for bachelor's degree equalling \$5,382.86 for a total of \$9,875.72

The position of Aide I was filled by the board with their choice of Carolyn Branch. Her salary will total \$7,133.60 after the board reviewed a letter of engagement from Billy Baker, Certified Public Accountant, to employ the firm of Billy

Baker. The Board agreed to employ the services of the firm to conduct the audit of the district's financial records for the period beginning Sept. 1, 1989 and ending on Aug. 31, 1990.

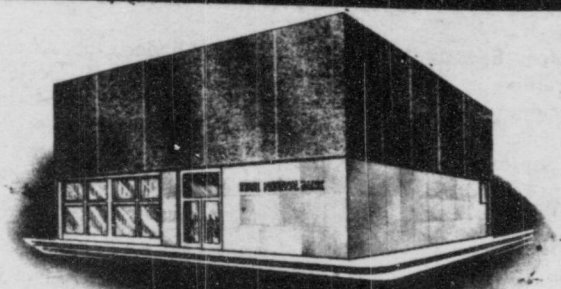

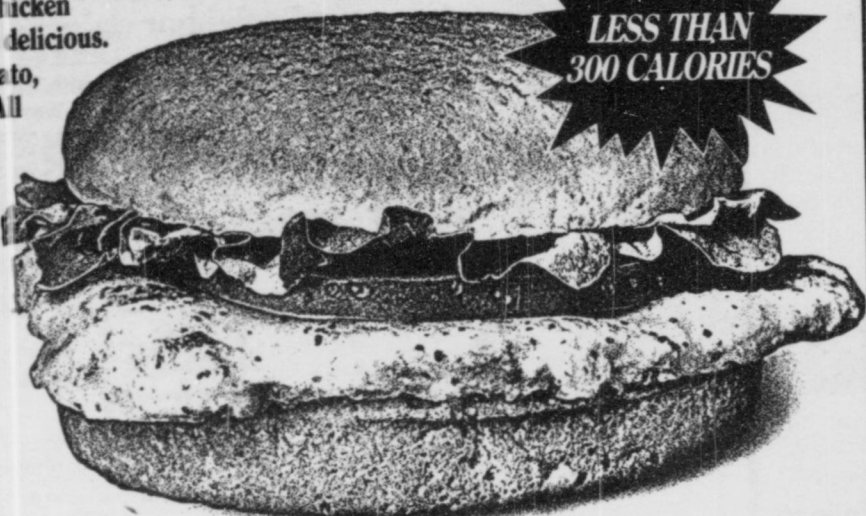

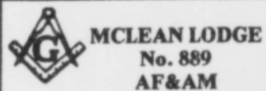
