Groom Wins Two Grands, Two Reserves



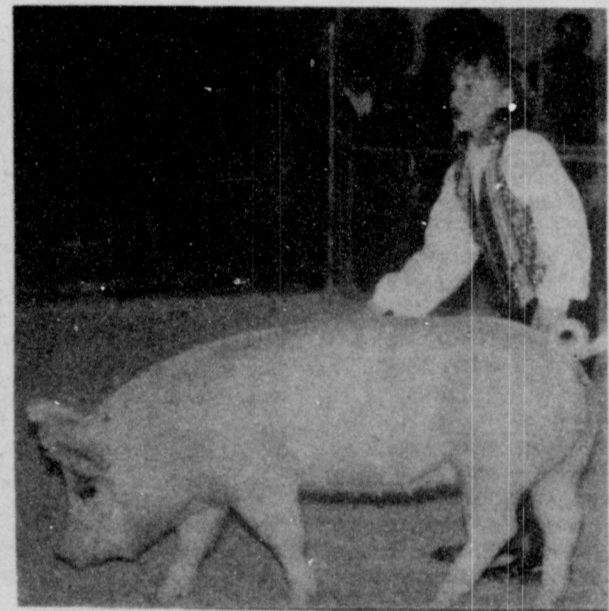

Carson County Sheriff's Report

By Loren Brand, Sheriff
Eleven persons have been received in the Carson County Jail since the first of the month. Eight persons are presently incarcerated for the following charges: 1 - Involuntary Manslaughter, 3 - DWI, 1 - DWI Felony, 1 - Parole Violation, and 2 - Game Violations.

The Sheriff's Department and District Attorney's office completed investigation into a series of check forgeries involving checks stolen from Gray County that were being passed in Carson County. One female subject is in custody in Pampa pending transfer to Carson County on the forgery charges.

After a series of farm machinery thefts in our area, one subject was arrested in Oldham County in possession of a stolen hay baler from the Groom area. This subject has previous convictions for theft, armed robbery and escape. Sgt. Ray Davis is the investigating officer and is coordinating our investigation with Oldham County.

Our department is working with the Department of Human Services to investigate an apparent case of child abandonment in Groom. The guardians of the child have left the state and decided to leave the child

with a family in Groom.

We assisted adjacent county departments in the investigation of a reported armed robbery in which a truck driver on Interstate 40 was relieved of money and equipment at gun point by an unidentified male suspect. The matter remains under investigation.

The Sheriff's Department assisted at area grass fires and checked several drivers who were reported to be driving in a dangerous manner on Highway 60 and 207.

We are currently investigating several reports of criminal mischief damage to private property in the area and working with the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission to identify persons who have been observed during photographic surveillance selling or providing alcoholic beverages to minors.

The Department of Human Services forwarded two reports to our office regarding allegations of abuse to children in Carson County. These cases will be investigated and forwarded to the County Attorney or District Attorney for review.

The Sheriff's Department will be investigating reports of juveniles consuming alcoholic beverages while on school property at various locations in Carson County.

In the Carson County Sheriff's Department

monthly report, by Lee Tice, there were forty-four persons confined in the Carson County Jail during the month of January, 1994.

\$540 in fees were collected by the Sheriff's Department in January and forwarded to the Carson County Treasurer.

Cash bond deposits for January, 1994 were \$21,744.50.

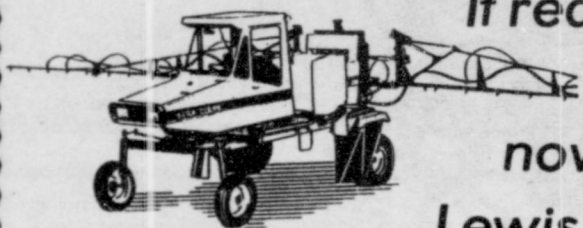

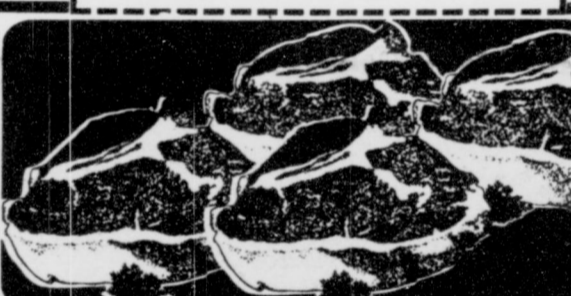
