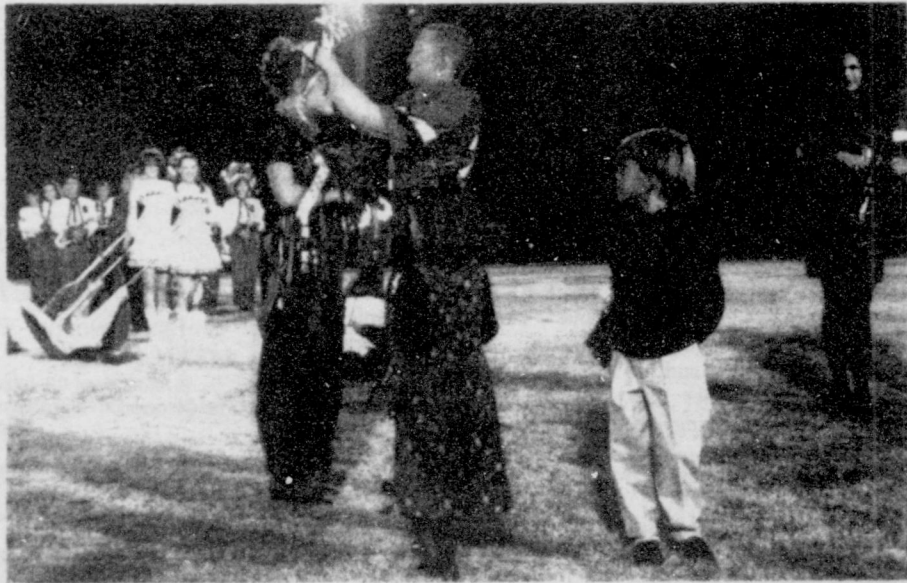

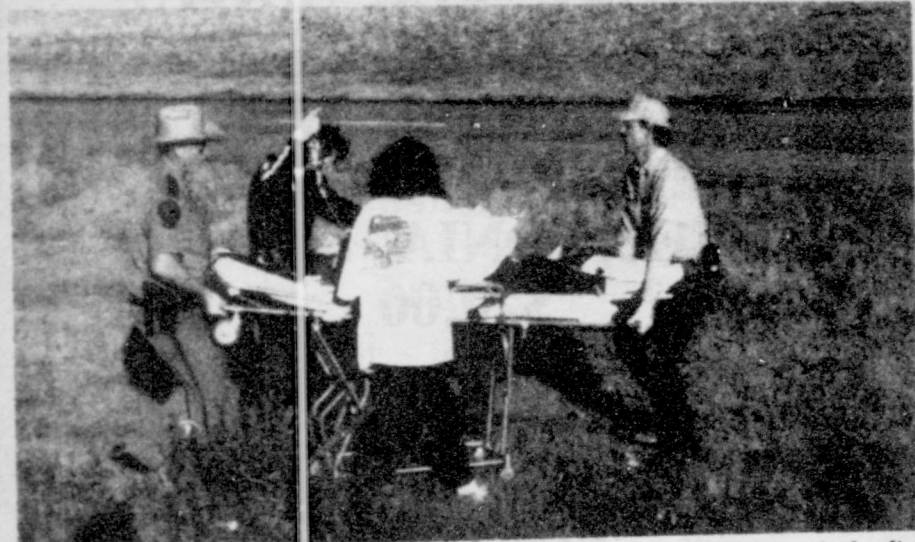

## Classes Win In Spirit Contest

The Student Council has been working very hard to think up new and interesting ways for students to get in the spirit of Homecoming. One of the new events this year replaced the traditional sign contest. "The Council decided to sell paper footballs to form a spirit chain. Three divisions were formed; high school, middle school, and elementary," commented Student Council Sponsor

The paper footballs were sold for 10 each or 12 for \$1. The footballs were then marked with the name of the class and put on the wall in the hallway end to end, forming a chain. The class in each division with the longest chain earned a special incentive.

In the high school division, the Senior Class won with \$1,614 footballs. They have

earned an extra 30 minutes for lunch on two different days.

The 8th graders won the middle school contest with 405. They will have a pizza party as their prize.

In the elementary division, the 5th grade won with 412 footballs. The amazing thing about this competition is that there are only 7 students in this class! They will have a pizza party, too.

## Tigers Win Homecoming Game, 35-12

"We were all eagerly waiting to see if the boys would be ready to play after the weeks activities," stated Coach Larry Reid. "But it did not seem like the excitement of homecoming hurt the focus of our players."

"Higgins is a quality team and we are pretty evenly matched."

The first half of the game was a very close match with both teams scoring two touchdowns each. During the second half the Tigers made some adjustments and successfully shut down the Coyotes defense, forcing them to change to a spread. Groom was successful in controlling it as well.

"We had one of our most productive rushing

games, with 320 yards on 36 attempts," said Reid.

Higgins only managed half as much with 154 yards on 34 attempts. Reid acknowledged the excellent work of the line for much of this.

"Evan Crowell, Wyatt Weinheimer, and Jamie Shuck just did a great job."

Groom accumulated 12 first downs compared to Higgins' 7. The Tigers had 49 yards passing, completing 2 of 6 including one for a touchdown. Higgins completed 6 of 19 attempts for 21 yards and one interception.

Groom had 1 punt for 13 yards while Higgins had 3 for a 39 yard average.

Toby Burgin had an awesome night, after

receiving the Homecoming King crown, he went on to sack up 166 yards on 10 carries and two touchdowns. He connected with one pass for 4 yards and had 7 unassisted tackles.

Wade Ritter carried the ball eight times for 75 yards and two touchdowns.

Dean Fields carried the ball 13 times for 60 yards. He also had five unassisted tackles.

Dewayne Gray carried the ball twice for 18 yards.

Chris Ollinger carried the ball once for 5 yards. He also had one fumble recovery, and 8 unassisted tackles.

Russell Conrad ran one time, earning one yard for the Tigers. He also caught one interception

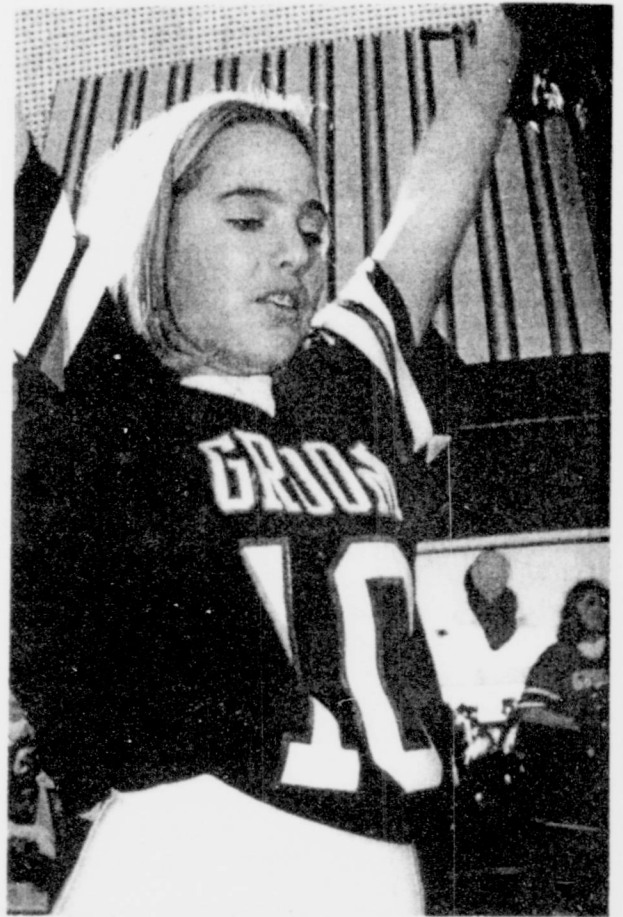
## Downtown Pep Rally Held Fri.

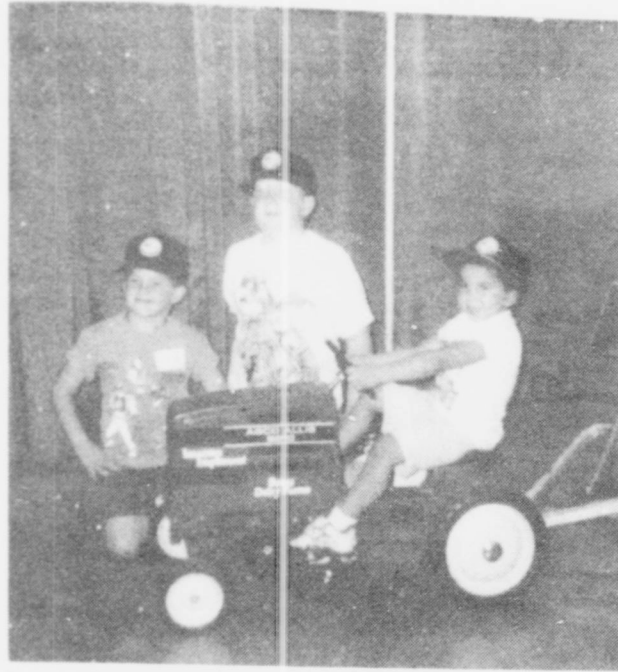

TO: All government officials in the State of Texas who have custody or control over records covered by the provisions of Senate Bill 1069, including motor vehicle records, records with information related to vehicular accidents, dispatch logs, towing records and 911 records, and/or who have authority to enforce any criminal provisions of Senate Bill 1069.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a suit has been filed in this Court that may affect your legal interests. This case has been certified by the Court as a defendant class action. A defendant class action is a lawsuit in which one or more persons is sued on behalf of other persons in the same or similar situation. As a governmental official within the class definition, you are a member of the class of defendants certified by the Court.

YOU ARE NOT BEING SUED INDIVIDUALLY. THERE IS NO REQUIREMENT THAT YOU ATTEND COURT, HIRE A LAWYER, OR PAY THE COSTS OF THIS LITIGATION. IF YOU CHOOSE, HOWEVER, YOU MAY HIRE YOUR OWN LAWYER. IF YOU DO SO, YOU WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PAYING YOUR OWN LAWYER'S FEES.

AS A MEMBER OF THIS CLASS, YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED OF THE FOLLOWING:

1. The Plaintiffs are two newspaper associations who have sued on behalf of their members. Generally, the Plaintiffs allege that S.B. 1069's restrictions on public access to motor vehicle records, accident reports, dispatch logs, towing records, 911 records, and any other records by which a person might obtain the date, specific location, or name of persons violate the Texas Constitution. The Plaintiffs also allege that S.B. 1069's prohibition against publication of motor vehicle record information on the Internet is unconstitutional.

2. The Court has certified this action as a defendant class action. The named defendants in this lawsuit have been certified as representatives of the class of defendants.

3. The Court has certified this action under Rule 42(b)(2) of the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure as a class action against the class of defendants as defined above. Under Rule 42(c)(2) of the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure, you are hereby notified that (1) Plaintiffs allege and will seek to establish that S.B. 1069 is unconstitutional, (2) as a member of this class, the judgment rendered in this suit will be binding on you, whether favorable or not, and (3) that you have the right to appear before Court and challenge the Court's determinations as to the class and its representatives.

YOU ARE ADVISED THAT YOU ARE A MEMBER OF THE CLASS and that if you choose to do so you may exercise the right set out immediately above to appear in Court and challenge the Court's judgments as to the class and its representatives. You may notify the Court of your intentions to do so at:

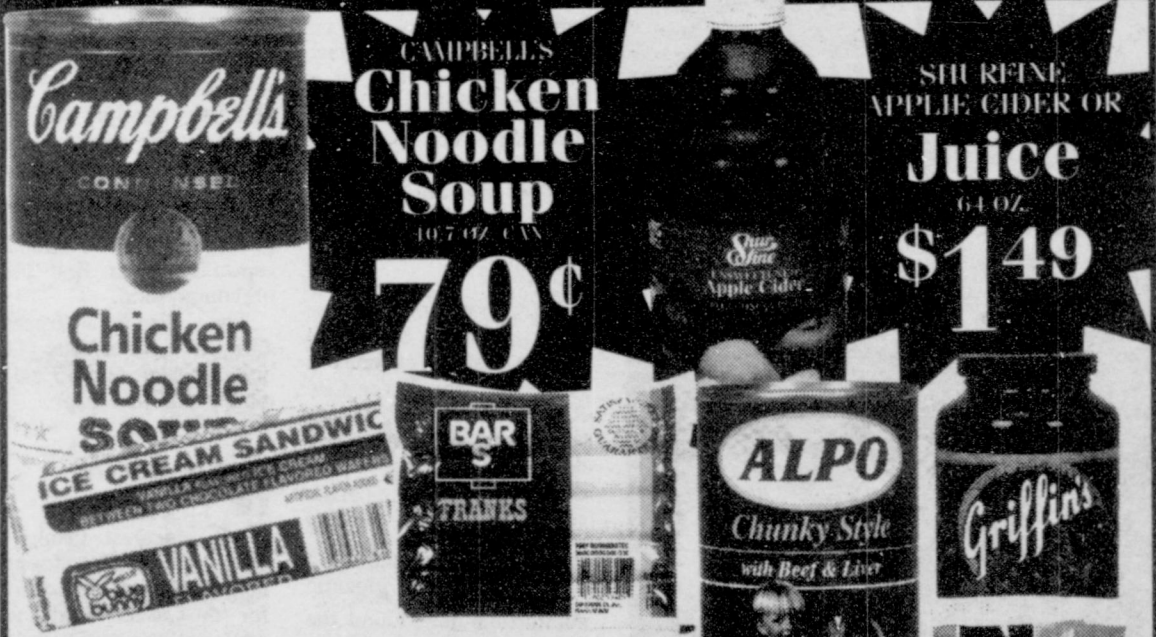

## Tigers Lose To Eagles 45-0, Chillicothe Next

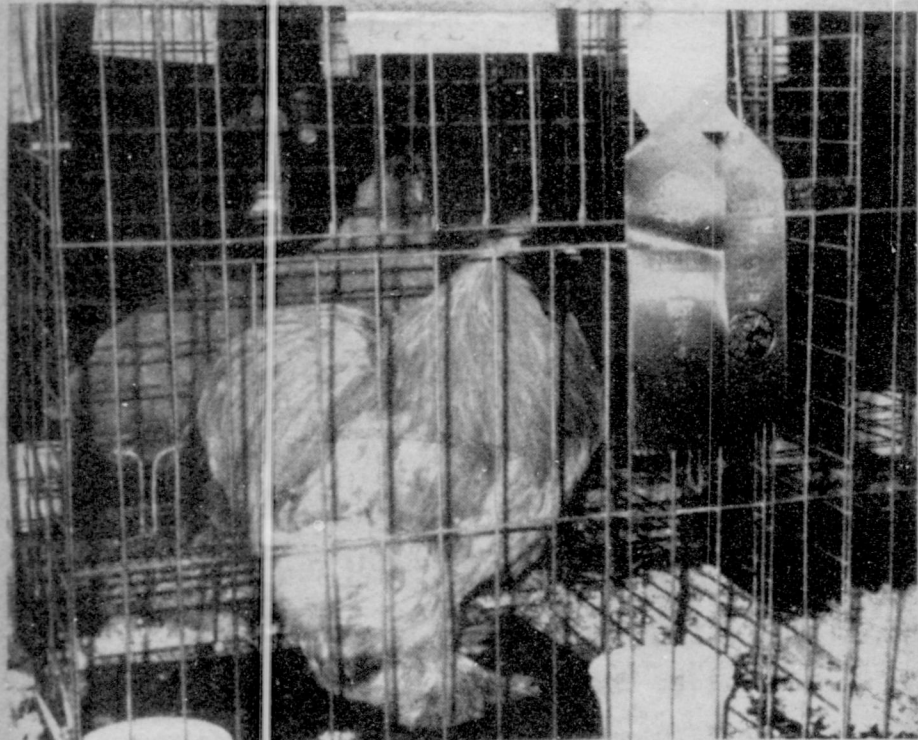
The McLean Tigers saw their playoff hopes dim even further, losing to the Samnorwood Eagles, 45-0 Friday at Samnorwood.

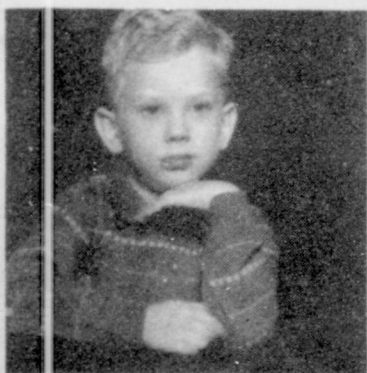



## Tree Seedlings Available From Gray County SWCD

The Gray County Soil and Water Conservation District is now accepting orders for tree seedlings. The conservation tree program is designed to offer tree seedlings at a nominal cost with the aim being to protect cropland, feedlots, and buildings, and to control erosion and enhance wildlife.

Several species will be available this year. The District will be offering potted conifers including Austrian Pine, Ponderosa Pine, Eastern Red Cedar,

Rocky Mtn. Juniper, Colorado Blue Spruce, Scotch Pine, White Pine and Pinon Pine.

Several species of bareroot hardwoods will also be available including American Plum, Aromatic Sumac, Bur Oak, Caragana, Catalpa, Contoneaster, Desert Willow, European Sage, Golden Willow, Green Ash, Hackberry, Honeylocust, Honeysuckle, Hybrid Cottonwood, Lacebark Elm, Lilac, Lombardy Poplar, Nanking Cherry,

Native Plum, Russian Olive, Shumard Oak, Siberian Elm and Skunkbush Sumac.

Wildlife packets will also be available. These packets include 25 seedlings each of 4 different species, and are

designed to enhance quail and pheasant, turkey, deer and squirrel populations.

The trees will arrive at the District Office around the 18th of March. The District suggests that tree orders be placed early as

many species sell out very quickly. Anyone interested may obtain an order form at the Gray County SWCD Office located in the Gray County Courthouse Annex on East Frederic (Highway 60 E), or by

calling the District Office at 665-1751.

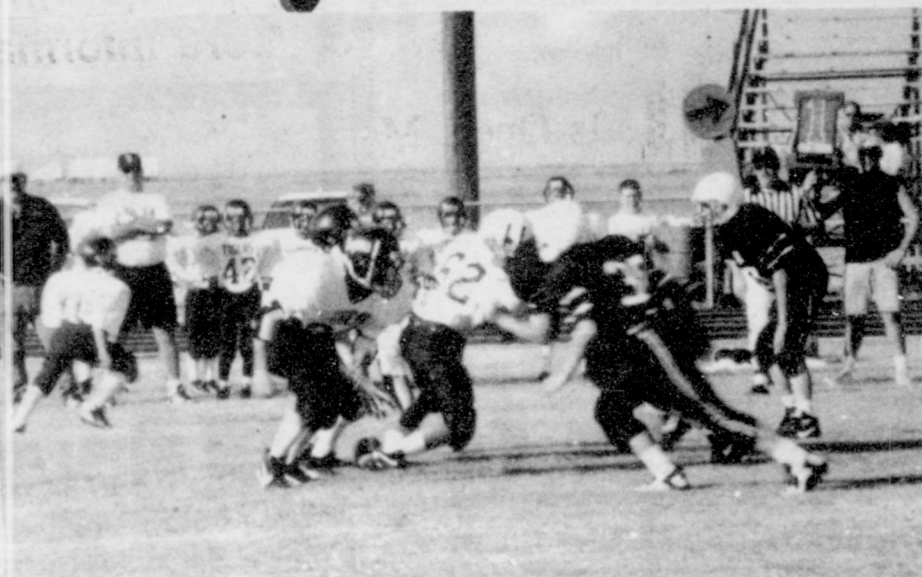
