Columbia To Kickoff Vital Info Card During '97 Groom Day Celebration

Imagine you are home alone and your children are all out of town...without any warning and never having heart trouble before you begin to have severe chest pains. You manage to call 9-1-1 and tell them you are having chest pains but lose consciousness before you can tell them anything else. The fact that you are on certain medications may be important to save your life, but who would be able to tell the ambulance team or

the doctors?

Columbia Homecare has come up with a great idea that could save your life. This Groom Day, Columbia will be distributing bright colored card that you can fill out and keep on your refrigerator that can help. The card will contain a place for information like who to call, your doctor's name, preferred hospital, Major illnesses and medication information. These cards have been

endorsed by Groom's Emergency Ambulance Service.

"The life-saving information that these cards contain will take much of the guess work out of our jobs," stated Ambulance Service President Jay Lamb. "It could very well be the information that will save a life of someone you love."

Brandon Crump was notified recently that he had been awarded his second full scholarship to Cisco Jr. College.

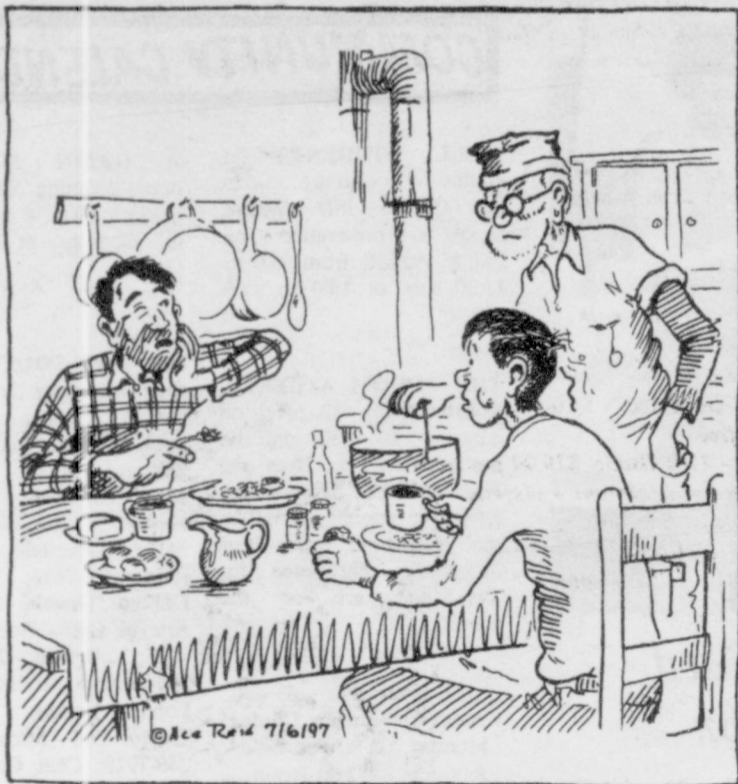

To sum it up, McDonald said the purpose of attending the school was "to bring back kinds of training to share with our department."



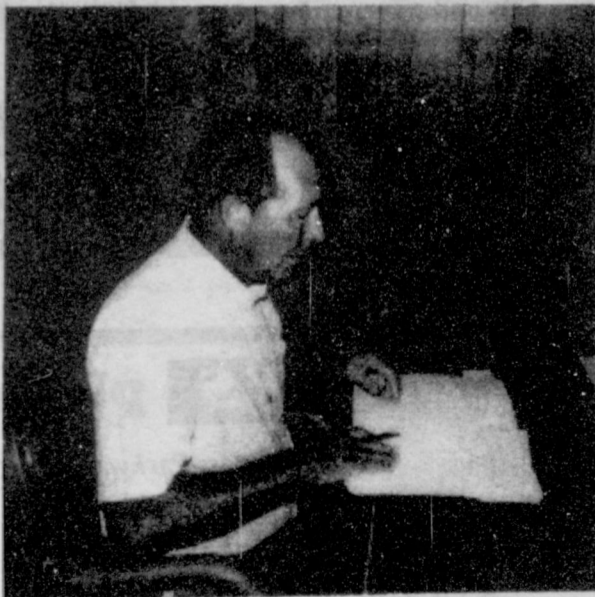

Alderman Sheplor opened the discussion with some figures and options he had worked up on closing or keeping the landfill. To close or keep the landfill open, the City will first have to find clay of the right seepage consistency to cover the pits as required. One of the alderman will be contacting the SCS to see if they can help find some clay in this area. Many options were discussed, but exact figures as to what it will actually cost to keep or close the fill are not yet

advertise for bids for garbage collection, to be opened at the Aug. 15th meeting.

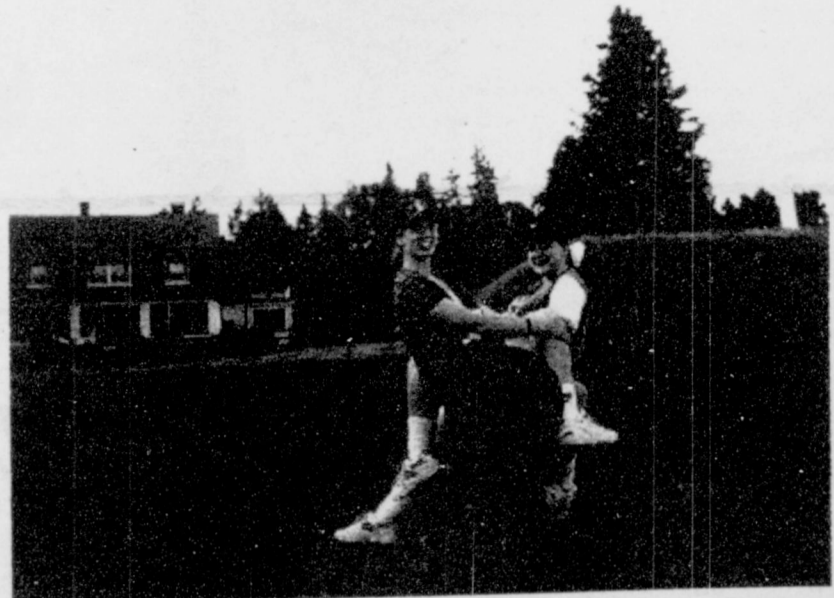


