Commissioners' Court met on October 10, 1997 with all members present. The minutes were read and approved and all claims were paid.
The Court amended the budget $\$ 34,345.55$ to allow payment of a claim from Business Records Co. The Company micro-filmed old records in the County-District clerks office in order to preserve and protect the integrity of the records should a disaster occur. The Court discussed the benefits of individuals who were employed by who were employed by the hour as compared to those who were employed full time.
Judge Roselius informed the Court that the Pantex "alert and Warning" siren in the Webb-Bragg addition would be tested at various times between October 20th-31st. The siren has been installed in order to notify individuals in the E.P.Z. (Emergency Preparedness Zone) should an accident
occur at the plant which might have "off-site" implications. A siren has also been installed at the rest stop on I-40 in the South/West portion of Carson County.

## Longtime Civic Leader Dies

John C. Haynes

John Cecil Haynes, 95, acLean rancher, civic leader and former mayor, died Sunday in McLean. Services were at 2 p.m. Tuesday at First
United Methodist Church in McLean with the Rev, Thacker Haynes, his grandson, officiating. Burial was in Hillcrest Burial was
Cemetery by Lamb $\begin{array}{lll}\text { Cemetery by Lamb } \\ \text { Funeral } & \text { Home of }\end{array}$ Funeral
McLean.
Haynes, who managed the J.S. Morse Triangle Ranch north of McLean beginning in 1914 , served three terms as mayor from 1959 to 1965 , a period of growh for the Gray County to wn.
After the McLean Clinic opened in 1956, he pushed for expansion of the facility into a hospital, a goal that was hospital, a goal that was
achieved in the late achieved
1950s.
As mayor, Haynes worked close y with McLean's larges: industry, Marie Foundations, when the garment factory tried to expand. He and company presilent Cal Fraser made trip to Miami, Fla., in 1962 to explore the possibility of
bringing worsen to bringing worsen to
McLean to wok at the McLean to wot at the
factory. Haynes and factory. Haynes and
other city leaders other city leaders
obtained a commitment obtained a commitment
from the U.S. government to pay the worr en's travel expenses, but the plan oventually was abandoned.
In 1963, Hyynes and his sons, Sam A. Haynes and John M Haynes, started one of the first feedlots in the Texas Panhandle, the Triangle Ranch Feed and Cattle Company two niles west of McLean.
Haynes helped his father-in-law, J.S. Morse bring some of the firs red Angus cattle to the Panhandle and later, with his sons, was among the first ranchers in the region to cros; Charolais cattle with otier breeds, primarily Angus.

As president of the Alanreed-McLean Historical Society, Haynes was one of several eastern Gray County residents who organized the Alanresd-McLean Historical Mus sum, which
opened in 1970 . He continued to work on historical marker for the Battle of the North Fork of the Red River, which occurred east of Lefors in 1872.
Haynes was a booster of the annual McLean 66 Roundup, Rodeo and Horse Show and for a few years in the mid1960s helped organize an annual trail ride to publicize the June celebration. A wagon train plus scores of men, women and children on horses traveled the 70 miles from McLean to Amarillo each year, Amarilio each year,
where the trek would be timed to end at KGNC timed to end at KGNC Smith's Saturday Farm Smith's Saturday
and Home Show.
and Home Show.
When he grew a beard
as part of the promotion, as part of the promotion,
Haynes often was mistaken for the character "Charlie Wooster" on the then-popular television show, "Wagon Train." Television host Smith played along with the joke and also each year called Haynes, then in his 60s, "the Old Gray Mayor."

Haynes was known for
Haynes was known for his humor. While Marie Foundations was manufacturing women's undergarments, the slogan he had painted on billboards at each end of town was "McLean: The Uplift Town." For a few years, he drove an orange Plymouth Superbird sports car with a hitch on the back to pull a horse trailer and once attached a hay bale to the spoiler that bale to the spoiler that
rose from the rear of the car.
Haynes was a charter member of First United Methodist Church in McLean, joining in 1911 He served on the McLean school board and the board of Highland General Hospital in Pampa. He was a longtime member of the Masonic Lodge, McLean Lions Club and McLean Golf Club.

Haynes was born in Indian Territory, now Oklahoma, near Mangum, Oklahoma, and lived in New Hope, Missouri, as
