

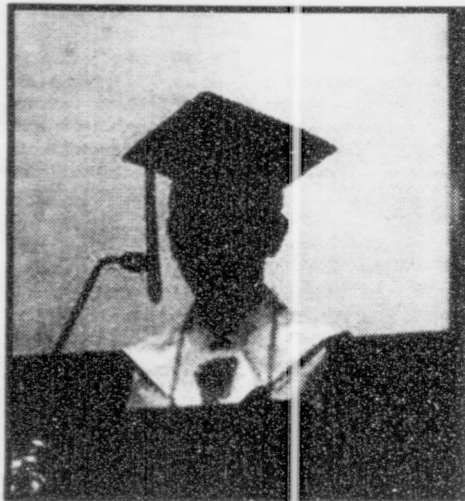

Ushers were junior classmates, Carrie Thompson, Connie Vega, Mandan Conklin and Kevin Smith.



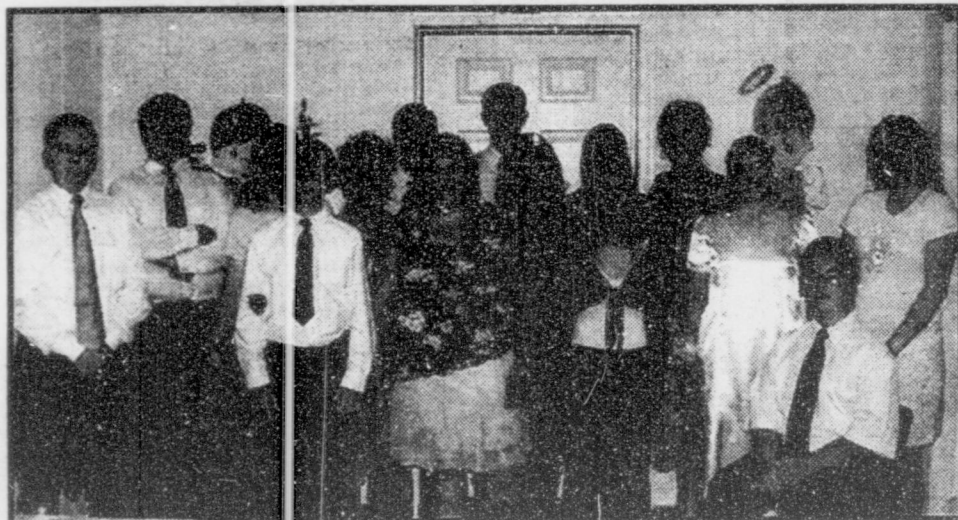
Commencement exercises for the class of 2005 were held Friday, May 27, 2005 at the First Baptist Church.

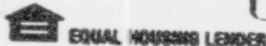

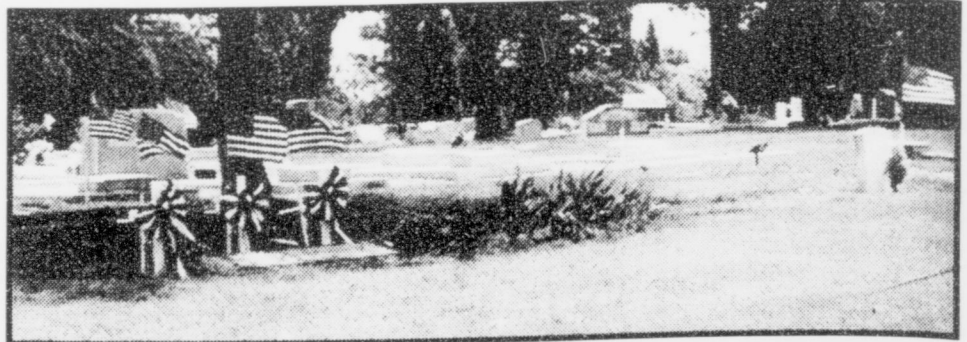

Richardson Signs With Bulldogs

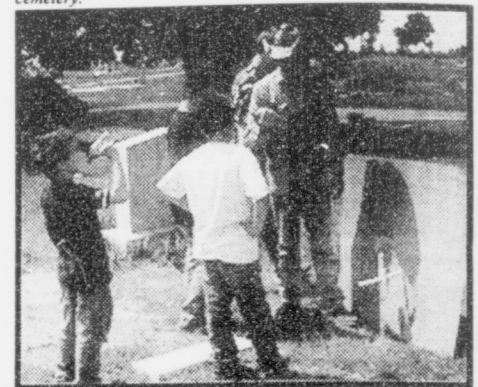


On June 24, graduating senior, Zane Richardson signed a letter of intent to play basketball with the Clarendon College Bulldogs.

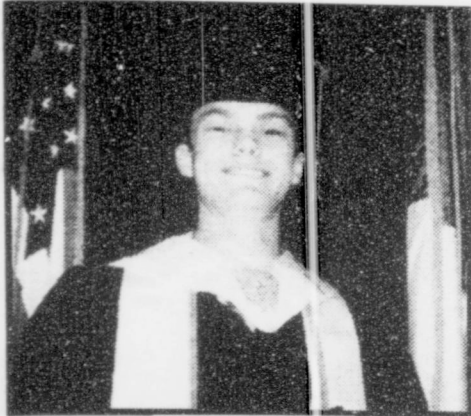

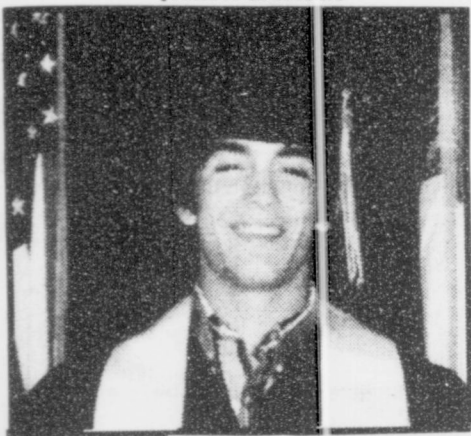

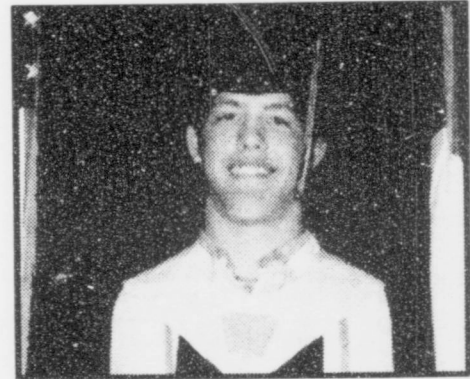
Jeff Rios was honored with two scholarships. The SS Scott Scholarship Award for \$150 and the Groom Lion's Club Scholarship for \$550.
