Churches Gather For Multi-Denominational Christian Unity Service



EOIP was established to assist landowners with applying conservation plans to treat major

natural resource issues, In Carson County, these include soil erosion on

cropland, plant health on ranch land, and improved water use efficiency on irrigated cropland, Eligible conservation practices include planting cropland to grass, terraces, waterways, livestock water developments (wells, pumps, windmills, pipeline and tubs), ncing and brush control. Eligible practices to

efficiency included new pivots on cropland irrigated 2 out of the past 5 years, pivot conversion, replacing leaky pipeline, and installing drip irrigation on previously irrigated land.
