#### Over 100 Conversions in Methodist Revival Which Closed Sunday

About 130 conversions and reclaimations and 47 additions to the church resulted from the which Methodist revival, closed Sunday evening at the tabernacle. Besides the new members added to the Methodist church, 22 gave their names for membership in other churches, 11 of whom wished to become Baptists, 5 Presbyterians and 6 Nazarenes.

Rev. Albert C. Fisher, who did the preaching, has proven to be an evangelist of exceptional ability, and McLean Methodists should count themselves fortunate to have secured his services. Rev. Fisher, assisted by his wife, who is a most capable worker with the young people, and Fred McClesky, an excellent choir leader, make up an son. evangelistic team that is hard to beat.

Mrs. Fisher held separate meetings for the young people in the Presbyterian church an hour before the regular tabernable service every evening, and on last Saturday organized an Epworth League with 57 members. Those who attended these young people's meetings were divided into two sides for an attendance contest, the losing side to entertain the winners at the close of the revival, and a marshmellow roast took place Tuesday afternoon with a large number present.

Warden Leonard did away with striped uniforms, abolished the lock-step, permitted talking at meals, organized moving picture shows and indoor games. He gave the men permission to smoke pipes, cigars and cigar ettes.-Ft. Worth Record.


