town, in Muskogee County, and the principal who has worked out the uneque system of credits for home work is a young ma named J. A. Houser. The sys tem was worked out by Mr
Houser in connection with Sup Houser in connection with Sup
erintendent of Schools E. N. Collette, who has evolved many Collette, who has evolved met the rural schools of the county. Briartown is a little settle nent which draws a large per centage of its school attendance from the surrounding country, When Prof. Houser became prin cipal of Briartown School noled that the children were
many of them indifferent home tasks and careless of their personal appearance. He set about remedy ing the matter, and
