Quail Stray Far From Home

Bobwhite quail are not usually considered a migratory bird, but Texas Parks and Wildlife Department biologist Don Davis is beginning to wonder. Last October, Davis tagged and spray-painted 442 birds for tracking purposes on the Matador Wildlife Area near Paducah.

He expected the birds to stick around long enough for some data collection. Just about the only birds collected out of the bunch were five shot south of Chillicothe in Hardeman County—some 50 air miles from the point of release.

Pond Fertilization Time Is Here

Fish ponds and lakes should be fertilized in the spring when the water temperature reaches 65 degrees, according to fisheries biologist Charles Inman of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Inman said the water temperature, and not the calendar, should be the guide for determining when to fertilize. Inman said the usual recommended dosage is about 50 pounds per acre of 20-20-5 or 16-20-10 commercial fertilizer.

THE FAMILY LAWYER

Peril at the Drive-In

Not all the trials and tribulations at a drive-in movie take place on the screen. Sometimes, misfortune also befalls a member of the audience. If a patron does suffer an accidental injury, may he hold the management legally liable?
To begin with, the management has a basic duty to maintain the premises in safe and orderly condition. Take this case:
A drive-in had a special "KID-ZONE" where children could amuse themselves while their elders were watching the movie. On a roadway running alongside this zone, debris of all kinds was allowed to accumulate. One evening,



the tire of a passing car hurled a bottle cap into the play area, striking a child in the eye.
In a court test, the theater was held liable for the child's injury. The judge pointed out that similar incidents in the past had given the management plenty of warning that the littered roadway was a source of danger.
Furthermore, the management is supposed to enforce prudent rules of safety. In another case, a theater made no effort to keep its patrons from sitting outside their cars on warm evenings. Yet it provided no fighting for the aisles—and no attendants to guide the oncoming vehicles.

When a car struck a patron sitting near an aisle, the theater was held responsible. The court said the way the place was run, it was "a stage setting for tragedy."
Still, some mishaps are not fairly blamable on the management. Thus:
A patron heading for the snack bar tried to walk through the narrow space between a parked car and a listening post. Bumping into the connecting cord, he knocked the speaker box against a woman seated inside the car, inflicting an injury on her head.
The hapless woman never could locate the walker. So she decided to sue the theater instead, arguing that its arrangement of listening posts and connecting cords was a "dangerous condition."

However, the court held that the theater was no more at fault than she was. The judge said the management could reasonably assume that the average patron, knowing how a drive-in theater is set up, would have better sense than to walk into a cord.

"I'm watching calories so I use a cream substitute. But wait, warns Gwendolyn Clyatt, Extension consumer marketing specialist at Texas A&M University. Cream substitutes do not have fewer calories than their authentic counterparts. A current study of cream substitutes showed these new products to have more saturated fat content than cream.

ACCENT ON HEALTH

If you had diabetes before 1921, you didn't give too much thought to leading a normal life--you worried about death. Then, researchers discovered insulin--a protein hormone--and a daily shot helped keep you alive.

Although the discovery of insulin was a major scientific discovery, the search continued for an orally active antidiabetic medication. Such a medication has now been found and your doctor or local health department can discuss it with you. Some diabetics are able to control the disease with the new oral medication. Those able to do this are no longer a slave to the needle, which is used when injecting insulin. And, hopefully, those who are treated early enough seem to have fewer complications later in life--problems with sight, kidneys, heart, circulation or nerves.

Diabetes is your body's inability to use food properly--especially sugars and starches. Diabetics have difficulty turning these sugars and starches into energy, which the body must have to operate normally. Insulin affects the body's use of food by regulating the use of sugar, which in turn supplies the energy that keeps our bodies going.

Half the people who have diabetes don't know it. They need to find out. Here are some of the symptoms which may mean you have diabetes:

Excessive thirst, frequent urination, excessive hunger, weight loss, falling eyesight, intense itching, pain in fingers and toes, weakness, tiredness and drowsiness.

Not all these symptoms are present in every diabetic. Some diabetics have only one or two symptoms. Others don't have any apparent symptoms and are called "hidden" diabetics.

Periodic blood tests can uncover hidden diabetics. In addition, Texas and other states, participate periodically in diabetic detection programs, whereby the local health department and migrant health

program personnel screen what is known as "high risk groups." In Texas these groups include: close blood relatives, at 45 years of age and older, of diabetics; persons 45 years of age or over, particularly; obese persons, 45 years of age or older; and parents of large babies (nine pounds or more at birth) when the parent is 45 years of age or older.

The Texas State Department of Health stresses the importance of finding hidden diabetics for three reasons: one, the earlier diabetes is detected, the easier you can control it; two, the more healthy you can stay; and three, the more normal life you can lead.
