him only two choices—either go to court to get his daughter reinstated or to see the superintendent and promise him his daughter would not drive her car to school any more.

"I didn't want to go to court, but I think I'm right," Andrews said. Andrews stated that he approached the school with the proposition that students be issued a permit on their parents' endorsement, and that the permit would be annulled in the case of any infraction of traffic laws.

He said that he had tried every means possible to allow his daughter to drive home to lunch, but nothing could be worked out. "She can't walk home and back in 30 minutes and have time to eat," he said.

The school, he added, had allowed an extra eight minutes but then took it off again.

He said that immediately after the rule he did not let Marsha drive because something was supposed to have been worked out. "But when it didn't, then I told her to drive again."

"I just don't think the school board has the right to control traffic on public streets," Andrews said. "Marsha has never parked her car on a public street."

The hearing is slated for 3 p. m. tomorrow in the district courtroom, Pampa.

### Student Auto Rule Contested

#### School Board Subpoenaed

Members of the McLean school board were subpoenaed this week to appear in Judge Lewis Goodrich's District Court in Pampa tomorrow (Friday) at 3, p. m. for a hearing to determine the validity of the board's "no-student-driving" rule earlier this year.

Plaintiff in the hearing is Clyde Andrews of McLean whose daughter, Marsha Andrews, was expelled from school on Dec. 9 for driving her car to school and driving it home and back during the lunch hour—a practice in violation with the school board's rule.

Andrews' attorney, J. E. Thompson of Pampa, obtained a court order the following day, Dec. 10, reinstating Miss Andrews in school until the hearing tomorrow.

Craig of the argument seems to be the school's position that it has jurisdiction over students 7 hours per day, including the lunch hour, versus Andrews' position that the school board has no right to try to control traffic on public streets.

The school board here made a rule prior to the opening of school that students would not be allowed to drive cars to and from school. This, according to President of the Board Jewel Meacham, was effected for safety reasons.

"We had several close scrapes last year with 50 or 60 high schoolers racing off the parking lot towards town just when the little grade school children were being dismissed," said Meacham.

Because of widespread student and some parent protests over the rule, a meeting was held some weeks ago on the problem, but no clear cut decision or agreement was reached other than that the board intended to continue the rule.

"It's all going to boil down to whether or not we have control over all student activities for 7 hours per day, five days a week, as the Texas Board of Education tells us we do have," said Meacham.

The school board's attorney, John Fullingim of Amarillo, asked Judge Goodrich earlier this week to disqualify himself in this case due to his friendship and business association with the plaintiff, Andrews. Goodrich, however, refused to disqualify himself from the case.

"We felt that because of their friendship and business dealings, possibly the hearing could not be completely unbiased," Meacham said Wednesday.

Andrews told The News Thursday morning that there was "nothing personal" in the case, but that the school board had left
