There will be a drugstore located in McLean.

After reading about the closing of Parsons Drug last week, several McLean residents were worried about the future of

McLean's other businesses and its elderly.

Even though several out of town pharmacies, including Gibson Pharmacy of Shamrock which will provide a five-day

delivery service to McLean, had sought to insure the future availability of pharmaceuticals, local residents were still leary.

However, Paul and Elmonette Bivens, both registered phar-

macists and owner of Bivens' Pharmacy in Clarendon, opened for business Monday morning in the lobby of the McLean

The city fathers met for their monthly meeting Dec. 11 in the city hall. Attending the meeting were mayor George Terry; city councilmen W.A. Bentley, June Suggs, and H.F. Fabian; city secretary Stella Lee; city superintendent Bob Glenn; C.R. Guyton, T. Elmo Whaley, S.A. Cousins, and Cathy Spaulding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The new regulations of the cemetery requirements were tabled.

No birds had been received in the telemetering systems, and councilmen agreed to hire Gor-

dan Maddox to do the 1983-84 audit.

Councilmen also agreed to possibly make a purchase on binders for meter reading books at the price of \$189.60.

It was also agreed that the bond payment on the gas system would be made. The payment, \$58,000 is due January 1, 1985.

Sam Haynes and Wanda Lamb were appointed to the board of the Lovett Memorial Library in McLean.

A request from Rush Turner, asking the council to pay for damages down on a sewer line that was allegedly damaged

four years ago when the new gas line was laid.

Councilmen then voted to pay the current bills.

Councilman Fabian informed the council that he was donating approximately \$50 worth of xerox copy paper to the City.

T. Elmo Whaley and S.A. Cousins then counted the votes cast by the citizens of McLean on the dog ordinance. The council received 289 votes for the continuance of the ordinance and 44 votes against the ordinance.

The purchasing of a new city pickup was also discussed.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

Of course, he has seen all the teams since football here, but I am sure we might get arguments from supporters of other good teams down through the years.

The year was 1932 and the starting line-up was Robinson, LE; Cash, LT; Ellison, LG; McCarty, C; Carpenter, RG; Back, RT; Crockett, RE; C. Christian, Q; L. Christian, LH; Tolliver, RH; and Switzer, F. Other members of the squad were Kinard, Ivey, Greer, Dowell, Ashby, C.C. Bogan, C.W. Bogan, Brock, Boyles, A. Christian, McCoy, West, and Whitfield. Coach of the team was Garrison Rush.

McLean won the district undefeated, beat Spearman in the bi-district and went to Wichita Falls to play Olney in the regional (which was as far as you could go) championship game. My father drove one of the cars which took the team to the game, and the weather was horrible with ice, sleet, etc., and required 9 hours to make the trip.

The field was covered with ice, and a harrow was used to try to break it up. Twenty fires were lit around the field to warm the sparse but brave crowd, and the players began the game with gloves on with

the end of the fingers cut out.

McLean finished with more first downs and yardage, but lost the game 0 to 6, even though they held Olney's big fullback "Bull" Graves to minimal yardage. Graves did throw a pass to St. Johns for the game's only score, "Cricket" Christian, Crockett and Switzer did the ball carrying for the Tigers and Tolliver did the punting.

All the Tigers played excellently on defense, and no doubt the ice greatly hindered the speedy Tiger offense.

Many will agree this was McLean's greatest team, but of course, there have been other great ones. Write in or call and tell me what you think the greatest was and we'll publish the results.

Beta Chi Conclave Hold Christmas Party Recently

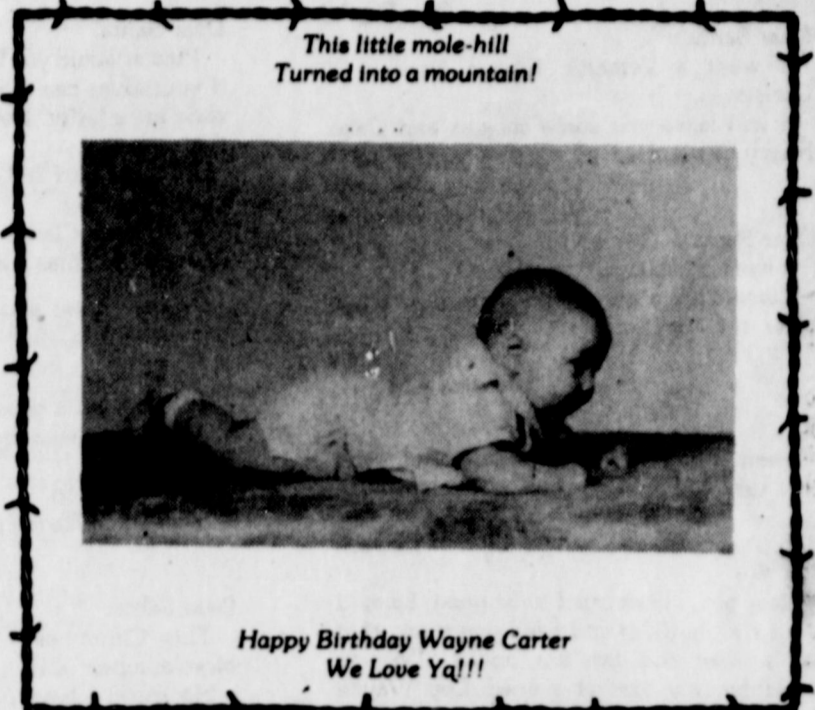

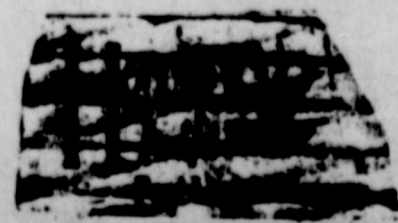

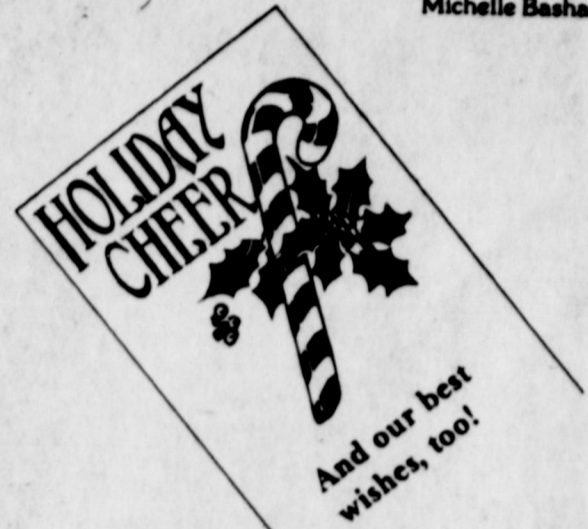

hospital building. Mrs. Bivens said that the temporary pharmacy will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and will offer prescriptions, over-the-counter drugs and general health and hygiene items.

According to Mrs. Bivens, quoted in *The Pampa News*, "The pharmacy will not be a drug store as such, as we will not sell gifts or cards. But we have anything you would find in a regular pharmacy."

Bivens agreed to operate the pharmacy temporarily until a registered pharmacist can move to town. Although prescriptions have been moved out of town, Bivens stated that if the customers would bring their bottles to the pharmacy, they would take the necessary steps to get the prescriptions approved by the doctor and refilled.

According to Paul Bivens, the couple plan to operate the pharmacy until a replacement is found. "If it went more than a year, we may have second thought," he said.

Bivens feels confident that McLean can support a young pharmacist because of the town's 60-bed nursing home and a supportive local doctor.
