City Councilmen Change Opening Hours Of Its Office In Monthly Meeting Dec. 13

City councilmen met Dec. 13 for their monthly meeting in McLean's city hall. Present at the meet-

ing were Mayor George Terry; city councilmen Loyd Bybee, June Suggs, Bill Thomas, Jim Barker, and W.A. Bentley; city secretary Stella Lee; and city superintendent Bob Glenn.

The council approved the Nov. minutes, and discussed the requirements that must be met

by McLean to have signs on the new Interstate highway. No action was taken.

A request from the Hillcrest Cemetery to the city was rejected. The

association asked city fathers to draw an ordinance that would not

allow curbs and grave covers to be put in the cemetery. Decision on the denial was unanimous.

Aldermen are also studying other town and the city services that are offered to citizens of those towns. The city will

compare McLean's services to those studied.

City councilmen are still investigating the possibility of working in a dog pound in conjunction

with surrounding towns.

Councilmen voted that no one can own a meter to

be connected to city services for city billing. The vote was unanimous.

Loyd Bybee abstained due to a conflict of interest.

City fathers decided to

of Sammon's Communications to complain about the service rendered by the Pampa office cable. The city will ask the head

office to give credit to McLean customers for the service missed during the Thanksgiving holidays.

In further action, the council voted unanimously to change the opening hours of the city hall from 8:30 to 8 a.m., effective Dec. 14.

Councilmen voted to pay bills, and transferred moneys from the ad

velorum taxes to McLean Funds to draw interest,

and made the bond payment of \$57,500 on the

gas system. Councilmen then voted to adjourn.

John Holland Reports Icy Roads Cause Six Wrecks

Icy road conditions caused a flurry of wrecks Dec. 15, as the Texas Department of Public

Safety investigated six accidents within about two hours, according to DPS trooper John Hol-

land. The first wreck was at 4:10 p.m. 1.3 miles west

of McLean on Interstate 40. Clarence Matthew Keller of Waterlout,

Mich., was towing a camper trailer east on Interstate 40 on an icy

road surface. He lost directional control and

the vehicle jackknived and came to rest off the

road to the right. He was not injured.

The second wreck occurred shortly afterwards 2.9 miles east of McLean on I-40. Jerri

Kay Peace of Naperville, Ill. was driving a 1984 Chevrolet Chevette when she lost directional

control on the icy road and hit a barrel at the side of the road.

At 5:10 p.m., 1.8 miles east of McLean on I-40, Tracy Lynn Russell of

Sierra Vista, Ariz., driving a 1978 Toyota, was traveling west when he saw an accident. He lost directional control on the icy road and went off

the road to the right. The car rolled over and came to rest on its top.

The next wreck occurred, a few minutes later

one mile east of McLean on I-40. A 1979 cabover truck, driven by Heber Shaffer of Edmond, Okla., was traveling east

when he lost directional control and the vehicle jackknived.

A few minutes later, 2.8 miles east of McLean, a 1971 White truck,

driven by Kenneth Matthew of Liberty, N.C. was traveling west of I-40 on an icy road. The driver lost directional control

and the vehicle jackknived and turned over onto its left side, then

came to rest blocking the roadway. At 6:16 p.m. 2.8 miles

east of McLean on I-40, Lloyd Edwin Baumbach of Stockton, Calif., was traveling west on I-40 when he ran upon the previous truck wreck that was blocking the road and the driver was not able to take evasive action.

There were no injuries in the wrecks.

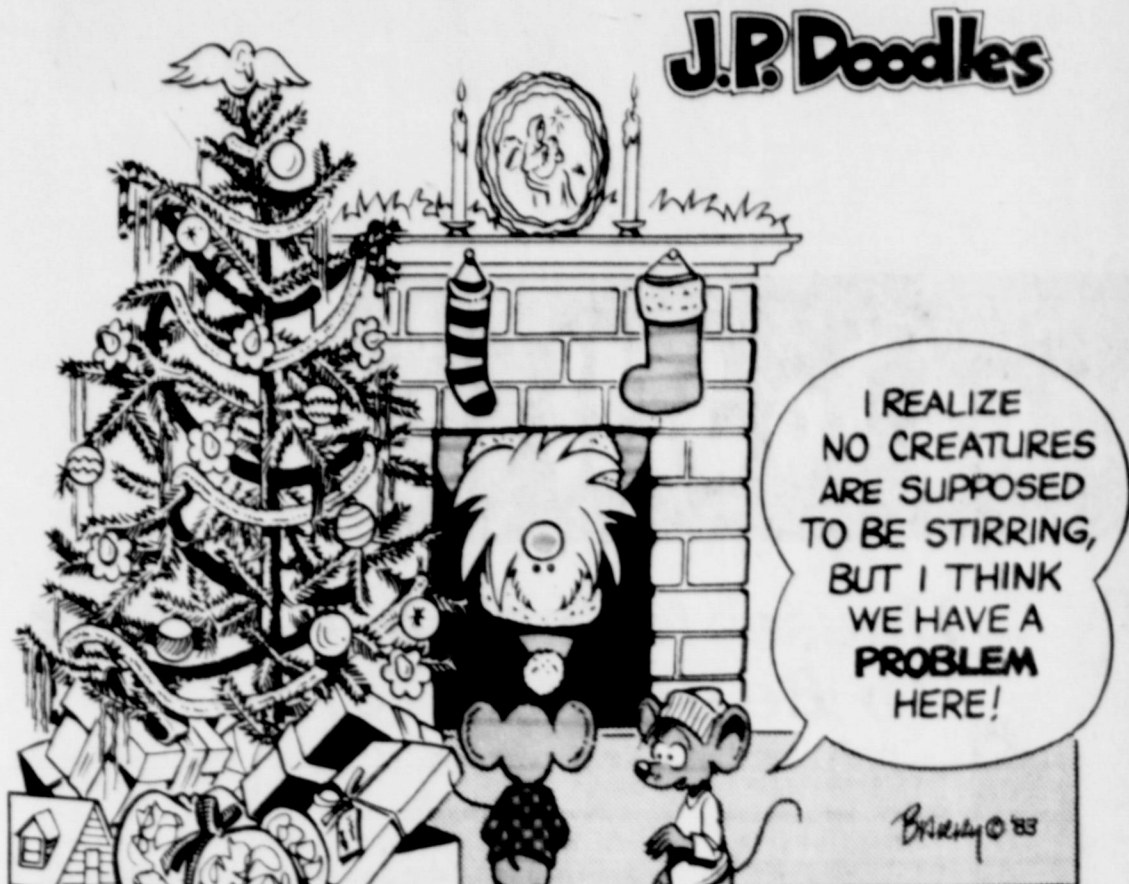
I will end this column on what I hope will be a more pleasant note, by

EFFORTS FOR SAFE DRIVING

AUSTIN — There are some signs of encouragement on the state's highways for drivers who fear drunken motorists.

Stepped-up enforcement by the Department of Public Safety has resulted in 26.7 percent more arrests for DWI in the first six months of 1983 than for the corresponding period in 1982.

Because of the work of the DPS and other law enforcement officers, our highways are safer. There were 884 fewer people injured in traffic accidents in Texas in the first six months of 1983 than in the first six months of 1982 and 321 fewer fatalities.

For the first six months of 1983 there were 9,361 fewer accidents than for the same time period in 1982.

I don't think the drop in deaths and injuries is due to the arrests alone. I think they are partly due to greater awareness of the

consequences of drunk driving, since this was an issue in the news for much of the statistical period.

Unfortunately, we will probably never be able to dispense entirely with fear of legal sanctions as a motivating factor in causing individuals to modify their behavior in regard to drinking and driving.

However, all human behavior is not ruled by fear alone. One important motivator, for many of us, is the sense that we are all together in making society work. We are responsible to our fellow human beings.

This sense of responsibility, to a great extent, motivates many across Texas to work to make our highways safe from drinking drivers who disregard the rights of others.

We can make this Holiday Season a safe one if we all do our part in keeping alive the message "Don't Drive and Drink."

Department of Public Safety Of Steps Up Patrols During Holiday

The Texas Department of Public Safety has estimated that 51 persons will be killed on Texas streets and highways during the Christmas holidays. The estimate is based upon previous holiday death statistics and the number of hours during which motorists are anticipated to travel.

"Last year, 44 persons were killed in traffic accidents during the actual holiday period. However, persons injured in various accidents across the state brought the final death toll to 52," said Colonel Jim Adams, director of the DPS.

Adams said while Texas is experiencing a significant decrease in traffic deaths statewide this year, the holidays can reflect a deadly time for motorists.

"As of noon, Friday, December 16, we had an 11 per cent reduction in traffic deaths and that is 412 fewer people killed. We attribute the reduction to increased DWI enforcement, widespread attention to the drinking driver and a renewed effort by drivers to obey traffic laws.

The DPS director said that holiday weekends are dangerous times to travel.

"We find the volume of traffic increases. Also, we still have some drivers who insist upon drinking and driving and others who exceed the speed limits. These drivers are risking accident involvement," he said.

DPS statistics show that DWI and speed are the two main contributing factors to traffic accidents in Texas.

"We'll have additional available troopers to assist the motorists and to be especially

watchful for the drunken drivers and those who speed."

Adams praised local police authorities for their work in reducing the traffic death toll and he applauded the various

local programs to help keep the drinking driver from getting behind the wheel.

Civic clubs, local police agencies and other organizations have begun programs to help prevent

drunk driving and this could help tremendously toward accident prevention. However, we will still find a few who will be on the road while drinking or speeding and will be involved in a

tragic accident," he said. The DPS "Operation Motorcade" program begins at 6 p.m. Friday, December 23 and ends 78-hours later at midnight on Monday, December 26. The program

is designed to inform motorists of the number of traffic deaths occurring during the holiday in an attempt to increase public awareness of the dangers of holiday driving.

One Brief Shining Moment Remembering Kennedy by William Manchester

John Kennedy and William Manchester first met in Boston in 1946. Young New England vets, they were both still recovering from crippling wounds suffered in the Pacific, where they both had been in fierce combat. While their careers

would diverge, the friendship and respect that had spontaneously developed when they first

met, grew and deepened over the years.

Knowing Manchester, confidant of his discre-

tion, and certain that he not only did not want but would never accept a government position, President Kennedy was extraordinarily candid in

their conversations. JFK encouraged Manchester to expand a series of magazine articles into the book "Portrait of a President." Because of that work JFK's widow and his brother Bobby selected Manchester to write the authorized history of the assassination, "The Death of a President." Research for that book gave Manchester extensive and frequently exclusive access to the

President's family, friends, and aides.

Manchester writes that while John Kennedy's death was a tragedy, his life was a triumph, and "One Brief Shining Moment" is a celebration of that triumph. Culling incidents from a friendship that spanned almost two decades, Manchester recally boisterous family gatherings at Hyannis Port, grueling campaign trips, and quiet evenings

alone with the President in the White House family quarters. The resulting book provides us with myriad anecdotes and insights into a life that bristled with vigor, competitiveness, and an unflagging drive for excellence; a life that shone with elegance, intelligence and compassion. "One Brief Shining Moment" is now available at Lovett Memorial Library.
