2 Wanted Men Nabbed In Early

Two armed fugitives were taken into custody Friday morning near the Village Shopping Center around 3:00 by night deputy, Jack Hyde.

Becoming suspicious, when he noticed the two loitering around the center in a 1962 Falcon station wagon, Deputy Hyde stopped them and asked for a driver's license. The driver opened the glove compartment of his car and as he was apparently reaching for a pistol, Deputy Hyde drew his gun and took both men into custody.

A further check by the sheriff's department revealed that both men were armed, one with a 45 automatic and the other with a 32 revolver, and both were wanted by the F. B. I. as well as Seventh Graders authorities in two states.
