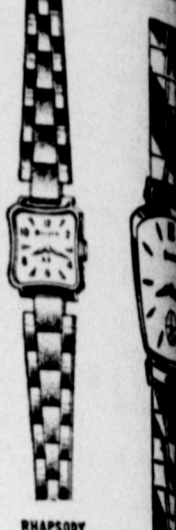

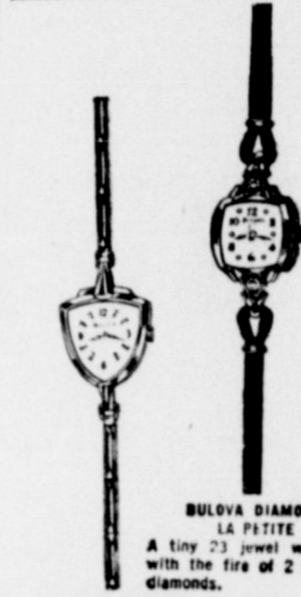
Canada. Tony family and school in Ozona.
