

After the fertilizers is added. apply a 1/2 to 1 inch layer of soil then continue adding layers of leaves and soil until the pile reaches the desired height. Bennett explains that the top layer should be left somewhat saucer-shaped so it will hold water. In three to four months, the leaves will decompose and become excellent materials for use next summer to increase the organic matter in flower or vegetable garden soils or as mulch for flowers, shrubs or vegetables.




