



Most of these fishermen use a cane pole, baited with either minnows or worms. They drop the bait alongside one of the cypress poles or the old dead pine stumps. They jiggle it a few times. If there is a hungry fish around they take it and move on to one of the thousands of other such locations within hollering distance.
