The accident occurred Saturday morning about 10 o'clock, approximately 17 miles miles from Ozona. Investigating officer Orvil Perry, DPS. said the late model car went cut of control on a curve. He said the car went off the road on the right, went into a broadside skid, returned to the pavement and began ta overturn.

Gibson was thrown from the automobile, which traveled a distance of 774 feet before coming to a stop after it left the road. The motor was torn from the chassis of the completely demolish-
