It would be interesting to hear a Scotsman try to explain why they bought golf equipment from Holland and what relation the Scotch game has to the old Dutch game of "kolf." According to the historians, not even the Dutch were the originators of the noble sport. The Romans knew the game long before, and called it "paganica." Though the Scotch take great pride in the sport today, in 1457 their Parliament passed a law in an attempt to discourage the game since it was interfering with the practice of archery, the mainstay of Scotch national defense
