What might have been a Col. James Mullins of Austin Colonel Mullins suffered a slight back injury and was flown back to their base at Bergstrom Air Force Base in X-ray examination at the Crockett County Hospital revealed no bones were broken.

The Air Force officers reported that both engined "conked out" simultaneously while they were flying west at 20,000 feet directly above Ozona. The delta winged fighter craft, the type now in use in Vietnam, fell in a circular dive that barely veered away from the center of Ozona. The fuel laden craft exploded with terrific force on impact with the ground, blasting out a craer about five feet deep, down to solid rock. 


