time. "He made up this story to tell the girl," said Brennan.



Pineapple Cocktail a la Dixie **Cream of Asparagus Soup Roast Turkey**

Candied Sweet Potatoes Onions au Gratin Cranberry Salad Pumpkin Pie or Nectar Ice Cream Manhattan Cup

Pineapple Cocktail a la Dixie

Mix two cups of crushed pineapple with the pulp and juice of one grapefruit and two oranges. Add one-half bottle Maraschino cherries and one-half glass melted red currant jelly. Thoroughly chill, Serve in sherbet glasses garnished with a sprig of mint.

Cranberry Salad

Cook one pint of cranberries with one cup of water and one cup of sugar until tender; press through a sieve. Soften one tablespoon of gelatine in one-fourth cup cold water; add the cranberry pulp and stir until the gelatine is dissolved. Pour a layer into a wet mould; chill: add a layer of diced celery, chopped walnut meats and olives, having the last layer of

cranberry jelly. Set in Kelvinator to mould. When ready to serve, place a square on lettuce and garnish with mayonnaise.

Nectar Ice Cream

Make one cup of raisins plump by adding a little cold water, bringing to a boiling point and boiling five minutes. Chill.

Caramelize one-half cup of sugar, add one cup of hot milk and stir until the sugar is dissolved.

Add one-fourth cup of sugar to two beaten egg yolks and combine with one cup of milk to make a custard. Cook the egg mixture until it coats the spoon. Remove from the fire and add the milk and caramelized sugar mixture and one teaspoon of gelatin which has been dissolved in one-fourth cup of cold water. Add a cup and a half of whipped cream, one teaspoon vanilla and one-fourth teaspoon salt. Pour into Kelvinator tray and freeze two hours, then add raisins and continue freezing for three hours.

Manhattan Cup

Combine one pint of Welch's grapejuice with one pint of sider, and thoroughly chill. When ready to serve, add one pint of sparkling water. This combination is sufficiently tart to be very appetizing at a several course dinner.






