





An eight or nine-pound ham is selected. In the water in which it is boiled, a cupful of maple syrup or soft maple sugar, two cloves, two peppercorns, a bay leaf, some celery tops and a small onion are put. The ham is boiled until tender, then removed and cooled, and the skin and most of the fat is removed. It is then spread with soft maple sugar mixed with fine bread crumbs, stuck full of cloves, and baked, being basted frequently with a cup ful of the liquor in which it was boiled, blended with one-half cup of sherry sauce and a little melted butter and black pepper, until a nice brown glaze covers it, and is easily pierced with a fork.






