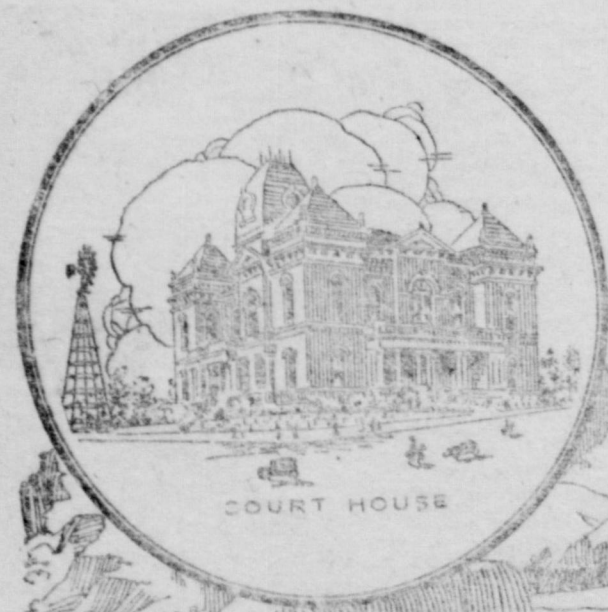

Big Wool Sales at Mertzon

Everything and everybody was busy at the West Texas Wool and Mohair Co. building Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. D. E. Hughes had set Monday as Sales Day, but things became so interesting that the selling could not be completed until Wednesday afternoon. Monday was the busiest day. The town was crowded with wool owners and others interested. There were about 20 buyers the first day and about 12 the next two days. 975,000 pounds of wool were sold at fairly good prices. More would have been sold had all the clips been complete. A few refused to sell at the prices offered.

General Manager Hughes gave all the sheep men and buyers a dinner every day and each dinner was a banquet.

The Association will begin shipping at once. This will clear much of the wool stored and give space for what is coming in.

This business is a help to the prosperity of the country. D. E. Hughes, as managing director of the Association, has made an enviable success of it.—Mertzon Star.

Rousing Meeting at Barnhart

A number of representative Ozonians went to Barnhart last Friday, according to previous announcements published in The Stockman, to attend the meeting of business men and ranchmen called there by the Barnhart Commercial Club to consider sundry and various important matters, principally perhaps the new law that will be allowed to remain unrecalled, virtually put the truckmen out of business.

J. C. Wells, of the Del Rio branch of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce, called the meeting to order and O. A. Carr, cashier of the Barnhart State Bank, was made secretary. Talks were made and resolutions were adopted strongly condemning the legislature and the governor of Texas for the highhanded and autocratic manner in which they have been acting, principally as injuring the people and interests of West Texas.

Other resolutions of a timely nature were adopted, notable among which was one calling for the sale of the University lands, as frequently advocated in these columns, and of which idea Judge C. E. Johnson, of Ozona, was one of the proponents.

A nice barbecue followed the meeting, Barnhart entertaining the visitors in its own good way.

Savage Race War at Tulsa, Okla.

Probably one hundred or more persons dead, and property losses amounting to approximately two million dollars, were the chief results of a race riot between whites and blacks at Tulsa, Oklahoma. The disorders followed an epidemic of outrages by negroes on white women and girls, which finally exhausted the patience and forbearance of white citizens.

The city of Tulsa was put under martial law, and order and quiet was gradually restored.

During the rioting, the entire negro section, housing thirteen thousand blacks, went up in flames. Some figures estimate the loss of life to be as high as 175, including ten whites and 165 blacks.

Business men of Tulsa have pledged the building of thousands of new houses immediately to restore normality to the city, but there are no lack of open declarations that negro outrages against white women will not be tolerated, if every negro has to leave.

DANGEROUS TO BE SAFE!

Indiana is now convalescing from a sixty-day epidemic of legislati. Other states are suffering a like sickness. Indiana found that in the last two years she has contracted 280 separate and distinct ailments, for which her doctors of law gave her treatment.

The worst part about these diseases of States and the remedies prescribed is the fact that by just passing imaginary boundaries you become automatically cured or stricken. You may be a staid married man in one jurisdiction, a divorced man in the next and a bridegroom in the third, and then within the same twenty-four hours you may pass into the state of bigamy. This is thrilling and makes of life one moving melodrama which would be fairly satisfactory if some fool officer in some fool State didn't try to enforce some fool law.

I have traveled in many States lately and have come to the conclusion that if a law abiding citizen wishes peaceably to pursue his way through America without danger of being haled into city police courts, he should take as a companion a legislative librarian thoroughly up to date in all the virtues, vices and vagaries of legislation to keep him informed as to what he may lawfully do. In some States, Louisiana for instance, he should employ a local guide conversant with parish boundaries.
