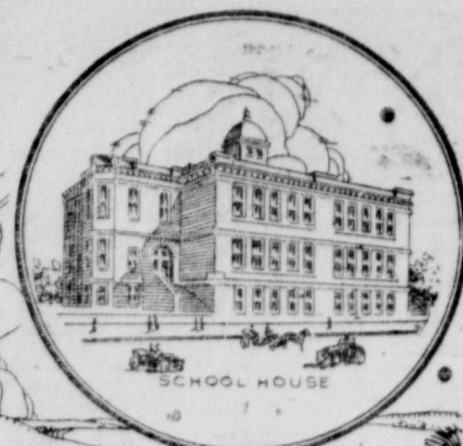

News and Notes for Busy Readers

Two men at Pleasant Grove, near Ranger, have been indicted on a charge of whitecapping.

Three bandits entered a Chicago jewelry store, and robbed the established of diamonds valued at \$10,000.

H. B. Balch, one of Sonora's oldest citizens, is the fourth candidate to enter the race for county judge of Sutton county.

By a vote of 279 to 78 the House passed the navy appropriation bill, which provides for a personnel of 68,000 men.

Russia has informed the Allied Governments that she refuses to pay war debts made by the Czarist and Kerensky governments, but recognizes all other debts.

Floods in the Mississippi valley have caused much damage, and requests for food have been sent to the Government from Illinois, Arkansas, Louisiana and other places along the Mississippi.

Stating that whipping by masked men of Texarkana citizens had "gone about far enough," the sheriff at that place instructed deputies and constables to employ every effort to stop them.

J. L. Carlyle, of Wichita Falls, was stopped on the international bridge at El Paso, and in a secret compartment of his car was found 138 quarts and seven pints of whiskey. He made no statement other than "it was hard luck."

Several hundred persons were killed, about 1,000 wounded and 30,000 made homeless as the result of an explosion of war material stores at Monastir, Serbia. The disaster was one of the greatest catastrophes of the kind in history.

Senator Watson, of Indiana, has laid before President Harding a plan to tack the soldier bonus to the tariff bill—"letting the tariff pay the bonus," as Senator Watson expressed it. The President gave his tacit approval of the plan.

Wool Growers' Central Storage Company, at San Angelo, has sold \$3,000 pounds of Spring mohair at prices considerably than that of last year. The greater part of the mohair sold is from Crockett, Schleicher and Sutton counties. The firm has about 35,000 pounds yet on hand.

District Judge Scarborough, of Corsicana, has been given positive information that that Corsicana Ku Klux Klan organization had been disbanded. The notice came from prominent members of the clan. Judge Scarborough has instructed the grand jury to make no further inquiries into the clan or its members and activities.

Tried, convicted and sentenced to death for the murder of his wife, brother-in-law and two other men in Arkansas, later escaping after having death sentence commuted to life imprisonment, is the story of Sam Bell, who had been living in Texas the past few years under alias of Joe Smith. Bell was arrested near Dallas a few days ago, handed over to Arkansas authorities, who carried him back to Arkansas, where he will serve his time.

WORST FLOOD IN HISTORY OF THE TOWN VISITS OZONA

Torrential Rains Locally and Heavy Cloudbursts North and East Cause Considerable Damage--Half of Ozona Under Water.

Last Monday, April 24th, the worst flood in the history of Ozona came upon us. Old timers, very old timers, think that just before the Civil War the two draws, between which the main part of the town of Ozona is situated, were in greater flood than at this time. Possibly so, but it can only be a matter of conjecture, as there were no houses here at the time. Certainly not since the earliest settlement of this little valley has there been such a tremendous inundation of water as the flood of April 24th, 1922, which will mark a page in local annals.

The ground had already been soaked from previous heavy rains and when it poured down steadily in Ozona and vicinity nearly all last Sunday night, the "draws" became taxed to carry off the water. Added to this, heavy cloudbursts to the north and east sent their floods into these outlets and they became roaring rivers. By ten o'clock Monday morning all the northern part of town was under water, and all that part of the residence section west except the houses on the higher hillside.

Only one residence was washed away. The five-room house of W. F. DeLong, a government trapper, in the western part of town, was lifted off its blocks about 11 o'clock Monday morning, and began moving away slowly and majestically, like a Mississippi River steamboat. There was no one in the house, the family having been on a visit to friends in another part of town. The house continued its stately and deliberate progress until it finally came to rest in the Patrick pasture nearly a mile away from its former location. Nothing was damaged, except by the wet. Even the dishes on the dining table remained where they had been left, and two buckets of milk stood without having apparently spilled a drop. The building was uninjured.

The flood reached its apex about 11 o'clock Monday morning. The water covered everything in the northern part of town "from hill to hill."

Many small outhouses in the rushing currents were swept away, all fences in the path of the torrent were swept away and became a hopeless tangle. Many residents lost heavily in

poultry and small animals met death, but the damage from these sources is inconsiderable, in the aggregate, and this fact is as amazing as it should be gratifying.

As is always the case in floods, there were freaky happenings. Stories of these would fill pages, and will give us food for conversation for a long time yet to come, when we refer to "The Flood of '22." The garage of L. B. Adams was floated across the street, but not damaged.

Water stood from an inch to two feet deep in many residences, leaving accumulations of mud and slush. "Such a Mess!" is the common expression of those particular householders.

The heavy rains did not reach more than a few miles to the south of Ozona, but the flooded watercourses filled all the drainage country to the South, and, being joined by the floods from Dry Devils River, Sonora reporting similar conditions to those in Ozona, Devils River, which drains all this immediate section, has been on a rampage.

POSTAL IMPROVEMENT WEEK

Next week—May 1 to 6—is Postal Improvement Week throughout the United States.

It is a wise idea upon the part of the postal authorities, and should be productive of much good to the service, and to the people.

Ever since the birth of the present administration there has been an intensive and sustained effort to "humanize" the great system which is, and ought to be, more intimately concerned with the daily life of the people than any other. President Harding himself has taken an intense interest in the service—in the righteous will and wish to "get closer" to the people.

Dr. Hubert Work, our Postmaster General, has the opportunity, and has the ambition, to become the greatest of all the great men who have filled that all-important position. Within the short time in which he has been Postmaster General he has made an amazing advance toward his high ideals. The

service has never been blessed with a chief of more lovable attributes or more intense personal loyalty for the good of the service, of greater earnestness for effectiveness upon the part of not only himself and his immediate assistants, but of the hundreds of thousands of men and women who are necessary to the success of this great popular service.

It is a compliment, direct and personal, to any man or woman, to be chosen as postmaster. A postmaster of the Presidential class is urged to realize his responsibilities. He is a Federal officer, holding authority, and over the signature, of the President of the United States. As such, he is the direct and personal representative of the government of the United States.

Postal Improvement Week should have a deep and earnest interest for every postmaster. There are many ways in which the service of the local postoffice might be improved, to the benefit, and possibly the appreciation, of the local public, and to the honor of the postmaster and his assistants. The service of every postoffice in the United States could be improved. It should be the first and most earnest wish of every postmaster, and of every postal employee, to serve well, without regard to the mere money consideration.

While all this is true, the people themselves might well remember that they could help greatly in effecting a more acceptable service. Postmasters and all postal employees are merely human. They have their own troubles, and their own limitations, and however earnestly they may wish and work, it is, after all, to the people served to whom they must look for help and sympathetic understanding, to the end of a greater efficiency.

Next week The Stockman will suggest a number of ways in which the postmaster can be helped, and how the postal service can be assisted to handle your mails with much greater efficiency, more satisfaction to yourselves and to the government. When you help a postal employee in his work you are helping yourself and your neighbor.

of Ozona have been disarranged. George Metcalf reports about sixty dollars damage. Water stood more than a foot deep on their floors and a large number of chickens were drowned.

Floyd Estes had just bought a fine lot of young chickens, all of which were drowned. His loss is near \$75.

The mail from Comstock came up Monday afternoon on time, but the carrier, Mr. O'Bryant, was unable to leave Tuesday morning. The Barnhart road Monday was impassable, the Cam Longley, the contractor, made two separate efforts to get the mail to Barnhart.

South of Ozona considerable damage to fencing is reported, and some loss to live stock. At Juno E. E. Stricklen reports twelve head of his grown sheep and a number of his lambs drowned by the sudden rise of Devils River.

FLOOD CONDITIONS GENERAL

Flood conditions have prevailed over the entire country south of the Ohio River, during the week. The Mississippi is on the big-gest rise since 1883.

Peoria, Illinois, has been inundated for the first time in seventy-five years.

In Texas the Trinity, the Brazos, the Colorado, the Sabine, and other rivers have spread over wide areas, carrying death and destruction.

From late telegrams received from Fort Worth it appears that that city is hit worse than any Texas city. The reports may be exaggerated. They usually are. It is stated that the Trinity is spread around at least three sides of the city, thousands are made homeless, fifty deaths, and millions of dollars damage to property.

North of Ozona the Conchos and all tributary creeks are in flood.

It will be several days yet before anything like a complete report and estimate of damages and loss of life can be made public.

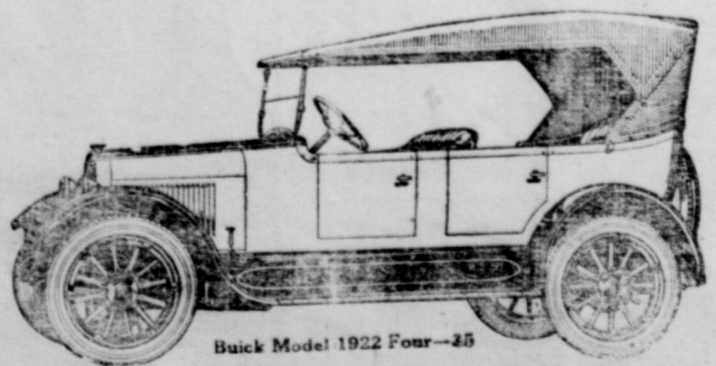
