To Eradicate Bovine Tuberculosis

Efforts are being put forth by the Bureau of Animal Industry in Texas and the Livestock Sanitary Commission to interest towns of the State in the area plan of eradicating tuberculosis in cattle. The plan contemplates an area being designated for the eradication of tuberculosis, and testing and slaughtering of reactors until the area is entirely free of tuberculosis, and the keeping of such area in such condition.

Dr. S. H. Moore, Veterinarian of the Bureau of Animal Industry, has spent several days in the Panhandle, visiting towns in that section and conferring with the city officials, health officers, dairymen and private citizens of the work. Sweetwater and Abilene were among the towns visited by Dr. Moore.

Dr. R. H. Harrison, Jr., veterinarian of the Livestock Sanitary Commission, has been doing a credited hard work in several West Texas localities recently. He tested cattle at San Angel, Robert Lee, Sterling City and Carlsbad. At Carlsbad he tested the herd of the State Tuberculosis Sanatorium.

E. W. Martin Dies in Fort Stockton

Sorrow was brought to many hearts Tuesday afternoon, April 17, 1923, when the death of townsman, E. W. Martin, was reported. The announcement evoked a shock to our entire community as it had been but a few days since Mr. Martin in his usual health, had mingled among his friends. Stricken Friday night, April 13th, with acute appendicitis, and undergoing an operation Tuesday morning which resulted fatally Tuesday afternoon, marked the course of his illness.

Edward Wilson Martin was born March 16th, 1893, on a farm near Brenham, Texas, where he grew to young manhood. June 5th, 1895 he was united in marriage to Miss Effie Harlan, of Port Sullivan, Texas. Mr. Martin, with his wife, moved westward in 1900, locating at Ozona, where he closed his career as a school teacher and a few months later crossed the Pecos river and embarked in the stock business, near Sheffield, since which time he has been numbered among Pecos county's most prominent stockmen. Some six years ago Mr. Martin and family moved to Fort Stockton that his children might have better educational advantages than offered by the Sheffield school. While Mrs. Martin and children have remained continuously in our city, Mr. Martin spent much of his time with his ranch interests.

The deceased was a man of education and culture, sympathetic, broad minded and public spirited. He was a loyal, consecrated Christian, and a faithful worker in the Methodist church, in which he will be sadly missed.

In compliance with the wish of the deceased, very simple funeral services were conducted Wednesday afternoon by his pastor, Rev. F. Glisson, assisted by Rev. Reuben Smith, after which interment was made in East Hill Cemetery.

Mr. Martin leaves to mourn his passing, his wife, two sons, Ned Martin of Carson City, Nev., and Harlan Martin and a daughter, Miss Margaret Martin, each of whom have the sincere sympathy of their many friends. --Fort Stockton Pioneer.

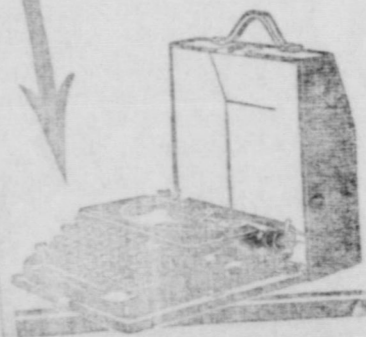

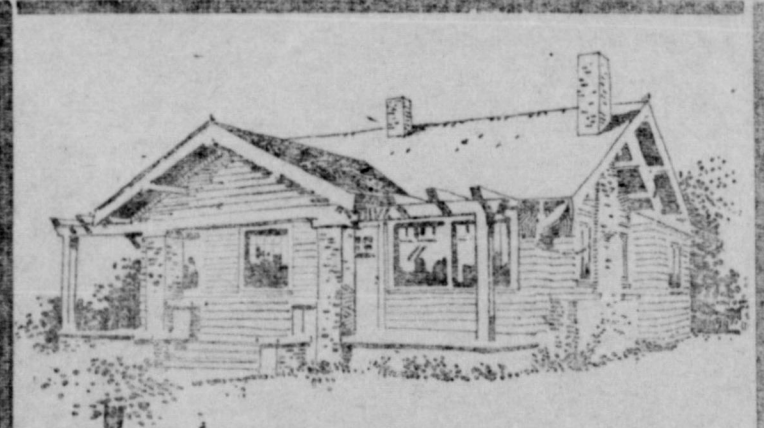

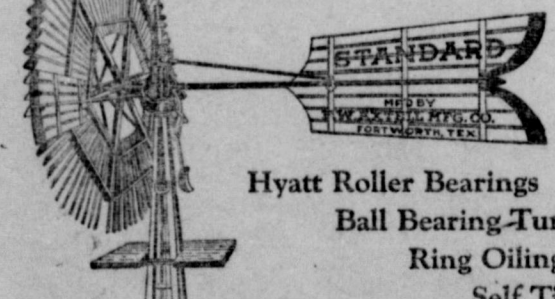
