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

Ozona probably has thebest op-portunity she has ever had or ever will have at present to secure a hospital. It is the general opinion that the community is not rea-dy to erect a modern building to house a hospital, that, of course, is an ultimate aim. But the need is too great right now to put off the project until the town is ready to spend from \$30,000 to \$40,000 for a modern building.

The way is clear, however, for a hospital that would adequately meet local needs. The Kincaid building is available and has been thoroughly inspected and pronoun ced suitable for the purpose. One of the strongest objections to this building, apparently, is that it is not fireproof. The building is not near any other and, as has been said, a hospital, with somebody on duty at all hours of the day and night, is less subject to fire hazard than any other institution

But leaders of the movement do not comtemplate that this shall be a permanent affair. In time it is hoped that the city will be in position to erect a modern build ing to house a hospital. Every piece of equipment that goes into the old building will be modern in every respect, and when the time comes for a new building, the e-quipment can be moved out of the old into the new.

Mrs Laura Hoover is leading the hospital move and her efforts in behalf of th citizenship of Ozona and Crockett County should win their undying gratitude. But their gratitude can best be expressed right now b" getting behind her in her efforts and getting down on the subscription list.
