Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas: Section 1: That Sections 2, 3, , 6, and 7 of Article V of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended so as to read as follows: Section 2 (of Article V): The Su-preme Court shall consist of a Justices, five of whom shall constitute a quorum, and the concurrence of five Judges shall be necessary to the decision of a case. No person shall be eligible to the office of Chief Justice or Asso ciate Justcie of the Supreme Cour unless he be, at the time of his e United States and of this State, and unless he shall have at tained the age of thirty years and lawyer or Judge of a court of re-cord, or such practicing lawyer and judge together. Said Chief Justice and Associate Justices shall be elected by the qualified
