Tariff Advocates

To Wage Fight In 1928 To Elect Tariff Men To U. S. Congress

An organized fight to elect United States Congressmen and Senators who are in favor of a just and eqitable, protective tariff policy on products of the farm and rapch is taking form over Texas under the leadership of the Texas Tariff Clubs in preparation for the 1928 elections.

Support of the leaders in each community is being sought by the organization through circulation of candidates for seats in the Natfollows at the head of the forms being circulated by the Texas Tar iff Clubs:

"We oppose any reduction in the present tariff duty o nwools, sheep, goats, cattle, vegetable oil, peanuts, poultry, butter, eggs, milk vegetables and truck, potatoes, berries, peas, beans, peaches, fish figs, dates, tomatoes, grapes and all farm and ranch products.

"We hereby agree that we will support in 1928 only those candidates for Congress and the United States Senate who will publicly declare in favor of a national pol icy of just and equitable tariff protection as stated above."

The declaration was signed by eight directors of the Crockett County Tariff Club and signers were secured in Del Rio, Sonora, Kerrville, Sanderson, Ft Stockton San Angelo and other West Texas
