The money will be used to speed the work of the National Committee—to administer to the needs of widowed mothers and their children.

A CITY EDITOR'S EDITORIAL ON THE FEMALE COW

The cow is a female quadruped with an alto voice and a countenance in which there's no guile. She collaborates with the pump in the production of a liquid called milk, provides the filler for hash, and at last is skinned by those she has benefited, as mortals commonly are.

The young cow is called a calf, and is used in the manufacture of chicken salad.

The cow's tail is mounted aft and has an universal joint. It is used to disturb marauding flies, and the tassel on the end has unique educational value. Persons who milk cows and come often in contact with the tassel have vocabularies of peculiar and impres-

sive force.

The cow has two stomachs. The one on the ground floor is used as a warehouse and has no other function. When this one is filled the cow retires to a quiet place where her ill manners will occasion no comment and devotes herself to belching. The raw material thus conveyed for the second time to the interior of her face is pulverized and delivered to the auxiliary stomach, where it is converted into cow.

The cow has no upper plate. All of her teeth are parked in the lower part of her face. This arrangement was perfected by an efficiency expert to keep her from gumming things up. As a result she bites up and gums down.

The male cow is called a bull and is lassoed along the Colorado, fought south of the Rio Grande, and shot in the vicinity of Potomac.

A slice of cow is worth 8 cents in the cow, 14 cents in the hands of packers, and \$2.40 in a restaurant that specializes in atmosphere.—Extension Animal Husbandry.

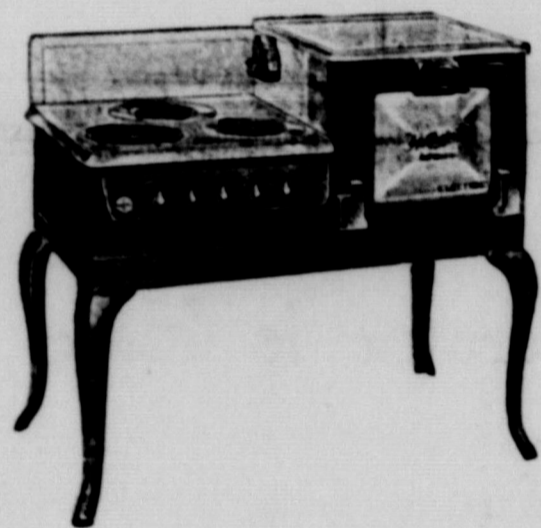

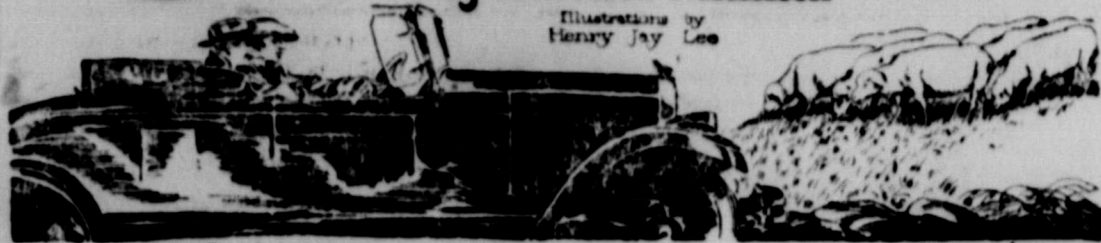

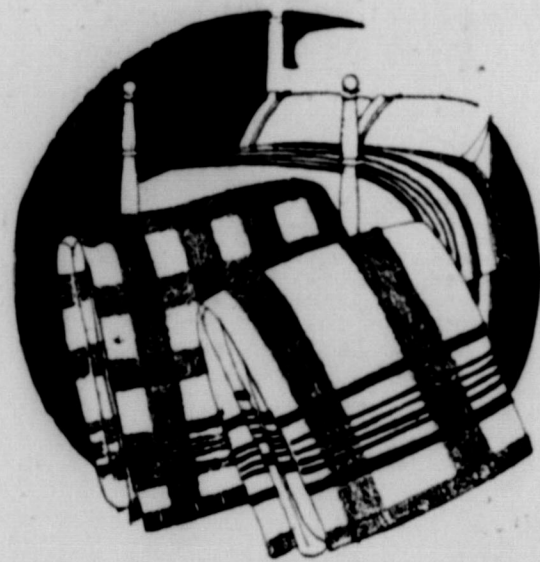

40-Horsepower Engine

It is not affected by heat or cold, withstands all kinds of weather conditions and is not easily marred or scratched.

Seven Models

The new Ford is being introduced with seven models, six different models in passenger cars and a new truck design. The passenger models include the New FORD SPORT COUPE, the new FORD ROADSTER, the new FORD SEDAN, the new TUDOR SEDAN, the new FORD PHAETON, and the new FORD COUPE.

Remarkable Acceleration

The new Ford is remarkably quick on the get-away. In tests in high gear, with a Tudor Sedan body and two passengers, it has accelerated from 5 to 25 miles an hour in 8½ seconds.

Practically Vibrationless

The engine of the new Ford is practically vibrationless. This is due in part to the lower r. p. m., the statically and dynamically balanced crankshaft, and the aluminum pistons. To insure quiet the timing gears are made of bakelized fabric instead of metal and the cams are so designed that valve clicking is prevented.

Gasoline Economy
