But He will not forgive you for depriving them of fresh air and sunlight that cost nothing." To prove that sunshine cures rickets does not mean much, when millions of city children can not have the sunshine.

Power companies worth twenty-three billion dollars don't want the Government to harness the Colorado River. That might mean competition in the power business.

Twenty-three billions is less than \$230 per inhabitant of the United States, less than the price of a small automobile. "Twenty-three billions" sounds big, but 115,000,000 human beings, all interested in Colorado River development, possess power also. 



One coil in waterproof case, distributor on top of motor and spark plug connections of bronze springs. And here's a big point for the safety from theft. A coincidental lock is placed on the ignition circuit. It not only replaces the regular ignition switch, but in the "off" position grounds the entire circuit. The wiring is in a steel cable and grounded to the distributor casing, thus making is impossible for a thief to wire around the device.

Standard, Selective Gear Shift

The transmission of the new Ford is of the selective sliding year type, with standard shift. It has three speeds for ward and one reverse. The main shaft runs on ball bearings, the countershaft on roller bearings and the reverse idler on bronze bearings. This is the highest type of bearing mounting and is unusual on light ears.

Exceptionally Easy to Steer

The steering gear on the new Ford is irreversible. Shocks are not transmitted back to the hands of the driver and a light touch on the steering wheel, which is exceptionally large for a small car, is all that is necessary to steer.

New 4-Wheel Brakes

The brakes on the new Ford car are an exclusive Ford development. They are of the mechanical, internal expanding-shoe type and are self-centering. This is the most reliable and the simplest type of four-wheel brake and the easiest to adjust. The brakes are housed in water proof and mud proof castings and are cadmium plated to prevent rusting and sticking. All adjustments are made from the outside without removing any parts. The brake pedal and the hand lever each operate all four brakes. Total braking surface is 168 square inches.

A Quiet Car

In designing the new Ford, every precaution was taken to prevent squeaks, rattles and drumming sounds. Body panels and frame sections are welded and riveted together wherever there is possibility of the body wearing. In all structural details the new Ford bodies are built to afford the utmost quietness and comfort.

Grease Gun Lubrication

The chassis of the new Ford is lubricated by the pressure grease gun system, the simplest and most effective method of lubrication.
