HALF MILLION **GALLON WATER** TANK PLANNED

New Reservoir To Be **Erected Higher On** Company Hill

DRILL NEW WELL Additions Will Improve Pressure And Wa-

ter Service

A new water reservoir with a capacity of approximately a half million gallons of water is to be constructed by the Ozona Water Works on the hill north of its pres ent plant, it was announced this week by Miss Dixie Davidson, man ager of the concern

The new tank, which will be of concrete, it is understood, will be higherthan the present tank and much larger. It will be 125 feet across and six feet deep. The present tank, which was just recently cleaned and repaired, will be retained as an auxiliary reservoir, for use in case of the necessity of repairs on the larger one and for

emergencies. Drilling of a new well was also begun this week in order to increase the supply of water for local consumption. The plant has been equipped throughout with electric motor driven pumps and has been given a general overhaul ing and repairing. A new road is also being contemplated by the management to the plant, going around the hill in order to eliminate the steep hill climb necessary

The new reservoir is expected up on the hill and a larger tank and will therefore increase the pressure in the mains considerably
