Occasionally a cow gets out of her pen, a calf breaks through, can do more harm to yards and flower beds in a half hour than they are worth. Of course, there is possibly no way of being certain at all times that one may not get out, but a strictly enforced stock law will prove a powerful urge to owners to keep their fences in the best of repair.

But the best feature of the law will be to stop the deliberate herd ing of sheep and goats, mostly by Mexicans who own not a foot more land than that on which their houses sit, along the draws, to stop the running at large of sheep and goats owned by ranchmen whose femils adjoin the town and who steadfastly refuse to repair their fences to keep these ani mals in pastures. If the law is passed and strictly enforced, if heavy pound fee is tacked on for every sheep, goat, cow, calf, horse, mule or hog found running at larganywhere in the county and the animal sold at auction for the pound fee if not redeemed, it will soon be possible for the people of Ozona to have pretty yards and feel save from an mansion that wiff spell run for their labors.
