Teach children not to put fingere Teach children not to put fingere in their mouths or nose—wash their hands well before meals. Teach children that kissing is dangerous, especialty on the lips.

HEAVY RAINS DROWN SHEEP WASH FENCES

Childress and Blain Report Loss Of 500 To 700 Head Sheep

DRAWS FLOOD CITY

Twelve Inch Fall Reported North Of Ozona, Four Here

Torrential rains north of Ozona almost assuming the proportions of a cloudburst sent draws in this section out of their banks Sunday morning and again Wednesday morning, resulting in the washing out of miles of fences and the reported drowning of several hundred head of sheep on ranches in the section between Ozona and Barnhart.

Approximately twelve inches of rain was reported by ranchmen between Ozona and Barnhart Sunday. The rain in that section, as in most of the area covered by the fall, fell in a few hours with the result that fences on flat praries on the divide were washed down for miles. Practically every water gap in the section was washed out.

The rainfall in Ozona was estimated at nearly four inches, which fell in less than three hours. The heavy rains to the north sent both draws through Ozona on a rampage, the Johnson To Be Discussed draw reaching the highest point it has been in several years. The water was back into the main street at the turn into the Barnhart road and was within twenty feet of the new hotel Ozona. It extended almost to the middle of the flat between Ozona and the Mexican suburb and the entire flat south of town was under wa-

The rain Sunday extended south of Ozona for about twelve miles, Early Baggett reporting a good seaking rain, but not enough to do any real damage. South of his place, however, got only a slight

Automobile travel through this section was at a standstill Sunday and most of Monday. Several hundred cars were lined up at the Johnson Draw crossing on the O. S. T. leading west out of Ozona and draws between here and Barnhart were impassable.

Wednesday morning's downpour again sent the draws through here out of banks and the draw on the east side of town reached the highest point it has been in several years. The water did considerable damage to fences and residence property along its course. The rainfall in Ozona was estimated at from four to six inches. with heavy downpours again being reported to the north. No estimates of the damage to livestock and fences had been receive I wed-




