It is our sincere belief that if a proposal to issue school bonds or road bonds were submitted to a vote of the people of Crockett County that either or both issues would carry by an overwhelming majority. And we shall continue to hold this belief until the vote is taken.

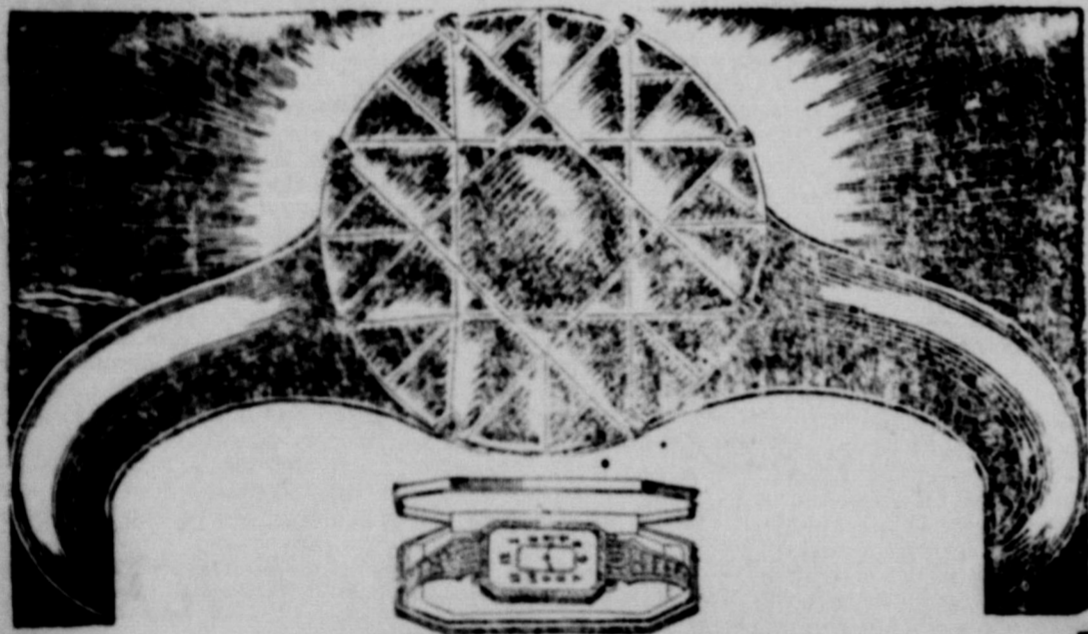

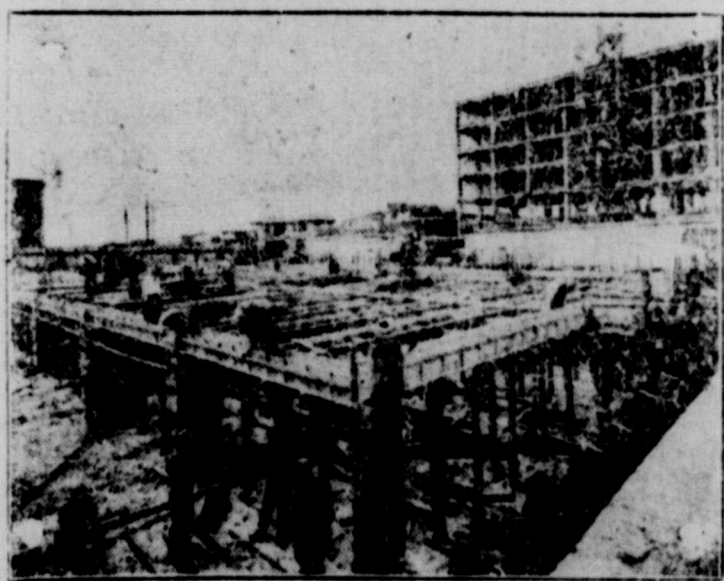

Baker-Hemphill's New Home Under Construction



This new building, the largest to be used exclusively for a department store in West Texas, will be the home of Baker-Hemphill sometime this fall, possibly by October. Construction started in March, and concrete is being poured this week for the basement. The building will have a floor space of 38,400 square feet, providing ample room for the growing business of this San Angelo institution.

The building will be of a light shade of brick, trimmed in ornamental stone, all retail floors, except the basement will be of terrazzo. Show windows will extend around the building, being broken only by the two main entrances that will face Beauregard and Irving.
