This movement was started at the regular meeting of the Lions Club Monday noon when Ben Lemmons of the Lemmons Dry Goods Company placed before the club a proposal that an investigation be made into the subject to determine what can be done in this di-

A. H. McLeod of the McLeod Motor Company and Lee Wilson of the Wilson Motor Company, called attention to the successful operation of the street oiling systems in Texon, McCamey and other towns and declared that the plan would be the next best thing to paving in Ozona.

A committee composed of Messrs Lemmons, McLeod and Wilson was appointed by President M. M. Fulmer to investigate various systems in use in other towns, to secure estimates on the cost of the work and report back to the club at future meeting.


