A plan worthy of serious consideration at the hands of the people of Ozona is that of constructing an incinerator on the site of the present dump ground for the purpose of destroying most of the trash and junk dumped there and to remove one of the greatest eyesores along the Old Spanish Trail.

Until an estimate of the probable cost of this project can be obtained, it is not possible to determine its feasibility. But if the cost is not prohibitive, it is likely that this plan would be as good as any for the final solution of Ozona's vexing dump ground problem.

An incinerator of sufficient capacity to dispose of the trash now accumulated at the dump ground

in a reasonable length of time and to take care of the normal accumulation would solve the problem nicely. Placed in the hands of a full time caretaker, the present most objectionable aspects of the road-side dump ground could be eliminated. If the project, which will likely be placed before the Commissioners Court when available data is finally assembled, is not unreasonable, it is to be hoped that it can be carried to a successful conclusion.

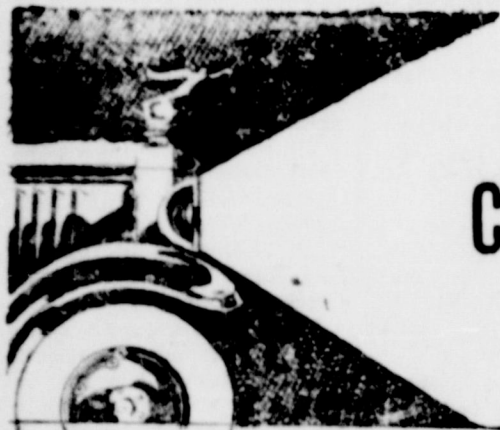
