We the undersigned, resident property tax-paying voters of Crockett County, Texas, hereby respectfully petition your Honorable Body to order an Election to be held in said Crockett County, to determine whether or not the bonds of said County shall be issued in an amount of Three Hundred-Seventy-five Thousand (\$375,-000.00) dollars, for the purpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, in connection with State or Federal aid or both on Highway 27 and the Ozona and Barnhart road in this county, and at such Election to have submitted to the resident property tax paying voters of said county, the question whether or not taxes shall be levied on all taxable prop erty of said Crockett County, subject to taxation for the purpose of paying interest on said Bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity. specifying in your order the a mount of Bonds proposed to be issued and that they be issued in denominations of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each and also specifying in said order that said bonds shall bear five per cent interest per annum, payable semiannually, and mature thirty years after their date, with option of pay ing one or more of said denominations at any interest payment date five years after the date of said

and it appearing that under the law it is mandatory on this Court to order such election, it is therefore ordered that an election be held throughout Crockett County, in the several election precincts thereof on the 12th day of April, A.D. 1930, to determine whether or not bonds of said County shall be issued in an amount of Three Hundred Seventy-five Thousand (\$375,000.00) dollars to be used connection with State or Federal aid or both, for the pur pose of construction and operation of a macadamized, graveled or paved road through said Crockett County, (this court having this day passed an order designating Highway No. 27 and the Ozona-Barnhart Road as the Highways on which the funds derived from said bonds shall be expended), such bonds to issued in denominations of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars each and bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually and to mature thirty years after their date, with option of paying one or more of said denominations at any interest payment date five years after the date of said bonds; and that advalorem taxes are to be levied annually on all taxable property within said county sufficient to pay the annual interest on such bonds and to provide sinking fund to pay such bonds at the maturity thereof. Such election to be held and returns made as in general elections and notice of the election shall be given by publication in a newspaper published in Crockett County, for three successive weeks and in addition thereto for three weeks prior to said election notices shall be posted at least four public places in Crockett County, one of which shall be at the Court House door thereof. All qualified voters who are property tax paying may vote at said election. All voters desiring to support the proposition shall have written or printed upon their ballot the words "for the issuance of bonds"and those


